Action SUBSTITUTE TEACHING - Davis (14-15 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)
 •During the last few school years and especially in the 2013-14 school year the District struggled to find day to day substitute teachers to cover all the needs of the District. The majority of our substitute teacher pool is shared with numerous other surrounding Districts and at this time District Administration feels it is necessary to increase the day to day substitute teacher rate from \$90 per day up to \$115 per day. A half day assignment would increase from \$54 per half day up to \$69 per half day. At this time we are not modifying the long term substitute rate which will remain at \$150 per day for consecutive days beyond 20 days in a particular assignment.
