7.1 Information TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN (TK) UPDATE - Boyle (11-12 G & O Component I, II, III, V, IV)

•California's budget crisis has resulted in a confusing roller coaster ride for families of incoming kindergarteners with fall birthdays and for school districts as the planning for the new Transitional Kindergarten program has developed. Transitional Kindergarten (TK) was to be the new program intended for children with November 2 – December 2 birthdays who missed the new November 1 cutoff date for turning five for kindergarten enrollment in the 2012 – 2013 school year. WPUSD had been moving forward with planning for Transitional Kindergarten until January, when the Governor's budget essentially eliminated the program, stating there would be no funding for Senate Bill 1381 which was passed in 2010, amending California Education Code to change the required

birthday for admission to kindergarten and first grade. Legal experts have now weighed in, and WPUSD is back on track for offering Transitional Kindergarten in the fall.

Mary Boyle reported the funding may not be available, but due to legislative action we are obligated to offer Transitional Kindergarten. The plan is to have one class at Twelve Bridges Elementary, if a second class is needed the district will look at possibly putting it at Creekside Oaks. Half of the districts have moved forward in offering Transitional Kindergarten, our district has been advised to move forward with offering the transitional Kindergarten.

7.2 Information LHS/ROP COLLEGE CAREER CAMP - Boyle (11-12 G & O Component I, II, III, V, IV)

• Lincoln High School is host to many excellent academic and Career Technical Education (CTE) programs which support the rigorous new Common Core State Standards, adopted by California in 2010. The standards, developed in collaboration with a variety of stakeholders including content experts, states, teachers, school administrators, and parents, and adopted by 48 states, establish clear and consistent goals for learning that will prepare America's students for success in college and work. Knowing that the transition from middle school to high school can be challenging for students and that students need assistance in establishing their career goals, Lincoln High School is teaming with Placer County Regional Occupation Program (ROP) to offer an ROP Career Camp during the first week of summer for district students who have completed grades six through eight.

Mary Boyle reported on a proposed Summer Career camp. The camp is open to students who just finished 6th, 7th or 8th grade, and who live in Placer or Nevada Counties, with the priority going to WPUSD. The camp consists of 5-day camp during summer at a local high school. From June 11-15th, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. including a snack break. The proposed Activities include: Information Technology Careers; Media and Film Careers; Agricultural Science and Mechanics; Robotics and Mechatronix Careers; and Engineering Careers. The cost is \$50.00 per student.

7.3 Information <u>LINCOLN HIGH SCHOOL WASC - MIDTERM PROGRAM</u>

REPORT - Boyle (11-12 G & O Component I, II, III, V, IV)

• Every six years, California public high schools participate in an accreditation process through the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), one of six regional accrediting associations in the United States. The WASC Accrediting Commission for Schools provides rigorous accreditation services for public, independent, church-related, and proprietary schools in California; additional WASC commissions provide accreditation services for community colleges and universities. In December 2002, UC faculty approved a policy that requires all California public and private high schools to be WASC-accredited (or a candidate for accreditation) in order to establish and/or maintain an "a-g" course list of courses that meet UC entry criteria. WASC accreditation certifies to the public that the school is a trustworthy institution of learning; validates the

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integrity of a school's program and student transcripts; fosters improvement of the school's programs and operations to support student learning, and integrates with the school's required Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA).

Mary Boyle presented the WASC review process. She presented a power point presentation showing student demographics; increase in API; CAHSEE pass rate in English/Language Arts, and Math. She also shared graphs showing AP/Honors classes completed; and increase of AP Exam pass rates. Also shared were the new approaches, expanded and new programs that Lincoln High School's staff and administration are focusing on to expand the educational program to meet the diverse needs of our students.

7.4 Action APPROVE RESOLUTION NO. 11/12 16 RE TRANSITION

PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM - Boyle (11-12 G & O Component I, II, III, V, IV)

●The Transition Partnership Program (TPP) extends special education transitional support services to special education students who are completing their high school education and entering the world of work. Western Placer Unified School District applied for and received a grant from the State of California Department of Rehabilitation to provide for these transition services.

Mary Boyle reported the Transition Partnership required a Resolution, and will be good for three years. Motion by Mr. Haley, seconded by Mr. Long, and passed by a 4-0 roll call vote to approve Resolution NO. 11/12 16 approving the Transitional Partnership program. Roll call vote: Long, Carras, Haley, Armitage

7.5 Action APPROVE PURCHASE OF MAINTENANCE VEHICLE - Lopes (1112 G & O Component V, IV)

•In August 2011, a maintenance vehicle was totaled in an accident. After applying the district's deductible, School's Insurance Group reimbursed the district \$7771 for the totaled vehicle. After reviewing multiple quotes, the Maintenance Department selected a vehicle that includes an upgraded SX package and heavy duty options. The Maintenance Department is requesting approval to purchase the new vehicle.

Joyce Lopes reported the purchase is needed. Motion by Mr. Haley, seconded by Mr. Long and passed by a 4-0 vote to purchase a new maintenance vehicle.

7.6 Action

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS ITEMS - Lopes (11-12 G & O Component II, V, IV)

●Board Policy 3270 provides that the Board of Trustees may authorize the disposal of surplus equipment when the equipment becomes unusable, obsolete or no longer needed.

The attached list of items have been determined to be unusable, obsolete or no longer needed and the district desires to dispose of these items online through The Public Group, LLC., which is designed to ensure compliance with state regulations and policies

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Joyce Lopes requested board approval to surplus disposal items. Motion by Mr. Carras, seconded by Mr. Haley, and passed by a 4-0 vote to approve the disposal of surplus items.

7.7 Action INCREASE TRANSPORTATION FEES - Lopes (11-12 G & O Component III, V, IV)

• The Governor's January Budget Proposal for 2012-13 includes a plan to eliminate all state funding for pupil transportation; thus, the full cost of home to school transportation will be borne by the General Fund. In order to partially offset the impact to the general fund, Administration is proposing approximately a 10 percent increase to the cost of bus passes.

Joyce Lopes reported part of the budget cuts from the state were to eliminate funding pupil transportation. The district will need to increase transportation fees to help offset cost. Motion by Mr. Carras, seconded by Mr. Haley, and passed by a 4-0 vote to increase transportation fees.

The education code gives the authority for high school athletics to high school governing boards. The code also requires that the boards, after joining CIF, designate their representatives to CIF leagues. This is a necessity! (Ed. Code 33353 (a) (1))

We are asking that, after action by the governing board, you send the names of league representatives to your CIF Section office. Obviously, the presumption behind this code section is that the representatives of boards are the <u>only</u> people who will be voting on issues, at the league and section level, that impact athletics.

If a governing board does not take appropriate action to designate representatives or this information is not given to Section offices within the required time frame, CIF is required to suspend voting privileges (CIF Constitution, Article 2, Section 25, p.16) for the affected schools.

At the State Federated Council level we will be asking that Sections verify that their representatives are designated in compliance with this Ed. Code section.

I hope this gives you a bit of background. Thank you for all you do to help support high school athletics. It is a valuable program in all high schools and we appreciate the support you give to the program and to CIF.

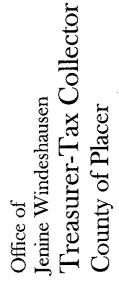

PREFACE

For the purpose of clarity the following glossary of investment terms has been provided.

Book Value is the purchase price of a security plus amortization of any premium or discount. This may be more or less than face value, depending upon whether the security was purchased at a premium or at a discount.

Par Value is the principal amount of a security and the amount of principal that will be paid at maturity.

Market Value is the value at which a security can be sold at the time it is priced or the need to sell arises.

Market values are only relevant if the investment is sold prior to maturity. Profit or loss would be realized only if the specific investment were to be sold.

Government Code 53646 Compliance Report

The following information is a monthly update of funds on deposit in the Placer County Treasury pursuant to California Government code Section 53646. Further details of individual investments are included in the Treasurer's Monthly Investment Report. All investment transactions and decisions have been made with full compliance with California Government Code and Placer County's Statement of Investment Policy.

Individual securities are priced at the end of each month by Wells Fargo Bank.

The Weighted Average Maturity of the investments with the Treasury is 1,519 days.

The ability of the Placer County Treasury to meet its cash flow needs is demonstrated by \$222,779,606.93 in cash and investments maturing in the next 180 days.

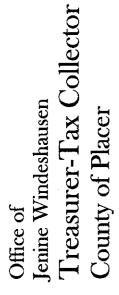

PREFACE

Placer County Treasurer's Pooled Investment Report

March 31, 2012

For the purpose of clarity the following glossary of investment terms has been provided.

Book Value is the purchase price of a security plus amortization of any premium or discount. This may be more or less than face value, depending upon whether the security was purchased at a premium or at a discount.

Par Value is the principal amount of a security and the amount of principal that will be paid at maturity.

Market Value is the value at which a security can be sold at the time it is priced or the need to sell arises.

Market values are only relevant if the investment is sold prior to maturity. Profit or loss would be realized only if the specific investment were to be sold.

Government Code 53646 Compliance Report

The following information is a monthly update of funds on deposit in the Placer County Treasury pursuant to California Government code Section 53646. Further details of individual investments are included in the Treasurer's Monthly Investment Report. All investment transactions and decisions have been made with full compliance with California Government Code and Placer County's Statement of Investment Policy.

Individual securities are priced at the end of each month by Wells Fargo Bank.

The Weighted Average Maturity of the investments with the Treasury is 1,535 days.

The ability of the Placer County Treasury to meet its cash flow needs is demonstrated by \$163,251,995.18 in cash and investments maturing in the next 180 days.

BACKGROUND:

GASB 43 and 45 require Western Placer Unified School District to analyze other post employment benefits on a biennial basis. Total Compensation Systems, Inc., provided the actuarial study of retiree health liabilities in 2008 and has been engaged again to analyze Western Placer Unified School District's current liabilities associated with retiree health programs.

RECOMMENDATION:

Administration recommends that the Board ratify the agreement between Total Compensation Systems, Inc., and Western Placer Unified School District.

CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into effective the 6^h day of April, 2012 by and between Total Compensation Systems, Inc. ("Consultant"), a California corporation with principal offices located at 5655 Lindero Canyon Road, Suite 223, Westlake Village, California, 91362 and Western Placer Unified School District ("Customer").

The following shall govern the provision of consulting services by Consultant to Customer.

- 1. <u>Consulting Services</u>. Consultant shall provide the consulting services described on Schedule 1 attached hereto.
- 2. <u>Compensation to Consultant</u>. Customer shall pay Consultant for the consulting services described on Schedule 1 attached hereto the compensation set forth on Schedule 2 attached hereto.
- 3. Term and Termination. (a) Term. This Agreement shall commence on the date first written above and shall continue in effect until October 31, 2012, or until all consulting services described on Schedule 1 have been performed, whichever occurs first, unless sooner terminated in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement. (b) Termination Without Cause. This agreement may be terminated at any time by either party upon sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other party. (c) Termination With Cause. Either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon the failure of either party to observe any of the covenants and agreements required to be observed by it under this Agreement, and such failure continues for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice thereof. (d) Rights and Obligations after Termination. - 5. <u>Authorization to Acquire Information</u>. Customer hereby authorizes Consultant to acquire the necessary information reasonably required by Consultant to provide the consulting services described on Schedule 1 attached hereto from any agency, agencies, source or sources.
- 6. <u>Customer's Right to Provide Information</u>. Customer represents and warrants to Consultant that it has the right to provide the information that will be given by Customer to Consultant, or which will be acquired by Consultant pursuant to paragraphs 4 and 5 above.
- 7. <u>Limitation on Services</u>. Customer understands that Customer retains sole authority and responsibility for the operation and design of all Customer's employee benefit plans.
- 8. Ownership of Systems and Materials. All systems, programs, operating instructions, forms and other documentation prepared by or for Consultant shall be and remain the property of Consultant. All data source documents provided by Customer shall remain the property of Customer.
 - 9. <u>Indemnification</u>. (a) By Customer. Customer hereby agrees to defend and

indemnify Consultant and hold Consultant harmless against any claims, injury, costs or damages (including actual attorneys' fees incurred) resulting from Customer's gross negligence or willful misconduct. (b) By Consultant. Consultant hereby agrees to defend and indemnify Customer and hold Customer harmless against any claims, injury, costs or damages (including actual attorneys' fees incurred) resulting from Consultant's gross negligence or willful misconduct.

General.

- a. <u>Relationship of the Parties</u>. The relationship between Consultant and Customer established by this Agreement is that of independent contractors. Consultant and Customer shall each conduct its respective business at its own initiative, responsibility, and expense, and shall have no authority to incur any obligations on behalf of the other.
- b. <u>Force Majeure</u>. No party shall have liability for damages or non-performance under this Agreement due to fire, explosion, strikes or labor disputes, water, acts of God, war, civil disturbances, acts of civil or military authorities or the public enemy, transportation, facilities, labor, fuel or energy shortages, or other causes beyond that party's control.
- c. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement and the Schedules attached hereto contain the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all previous agreements and proposals, oral or written, and all negotiations, conversations, or discussions between the parties related to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be deemed or construed to be modified, amended, rescinded, canceled or waived in whole or in part, except by written amendment signed by both of the parties hereto.

BP 3314.2 - Revolving Funds

(BP revised)

Updated policy reorganized to reflect various types of revolving funds authorized by law, including the purposes and limits of the funds. Policy also contains new language specifying that such funds are subject to the district's internal control procedures established for the purpose of fraud prevention and financial impropriety and must be maintained in accordance with the California School Accounting Manual.

AR 3440 - Inventories

(AR revised)

Updated regulation clarifies state Categorical Program Monitoring criteria re: circumstances under which equipment purchased with state or federal categorical funds must be inventoried. Regulation also revised to more directly reflect law re: contents of the inventory, to add language on labeling and tracking of equipment, and to expand section on "Physical Inventory" to address procedures for physical inventory and investigation in the event a discrepancy is found.

BP 6170.1 - Transitional Kindergarten

(BP added)

New policy reflects **NEW LAW** (SB 1381, 2010) which requires districts to establish "transitional kindergarten" programs beginning in the 2012-13 school year for children whose admission to kindergarten is delayed due to changes in law affecting the age criterion for admission to kindergarten. Policy addresses student eligibility for the program, curriculum and instruction, staffing, and students' continuation to kindergarten at the completion of the transitional kindergarten program.

REVOLVING FUNDS

District Revolving Fund

The Board of Trustees has a fiduciary responsibility to effectively manage and safeguard the district's assets and resources. All revolving cash funds shall be subject to the internal control procedures established by the districts to prevent and detect fraud, financial impropriety, or irregularity and shall be maintained in accordance with law and the California Accounting Manual. resolution a revolving cash fund for use by the Superintendent or designee in paying for goods, services and other charges determined by the Board, including supplemental payments required to correct any payroll errors. (Education Code 42800-42806, 45167)

The funds shall be deposited in a bank doing business locally, whose deposits are insured by FDIC. The Superintendent or designee shall be responsible for all payments into the account as well as expenditures from the account subject to the restrictions established by the Board.

The Board shall review and revise fund usage as appropriate.

Standard Additional Revolving Cash Funds

Pursuant to Education Code 42800, the Board has adopted a also may, by resolution establishing a revolving cash funds for use by Superintendent or designee. school principals and other administrative officials to pay for goods and services. The total amount of The funds shall be used only for the purposes specified in the Board's resolution which may include, but are not limited to, payment for services or supplies for which there is an urgent deadline or to reduce the need for issuing numerous small warrants. not exceed three percent of the current year's instructional supply budget. (Education Code 42810)

The Superintendent or designee shall be covered by an individual bond or insurance in the amounts specified in law. He/she shall ensure that payments from the fund are for services or materials that are a legal charge against the district and that a receipt is obtained setting forth the date, payee, purpose of the expenditure, and amount expended. (Education Code 41021, 42801, 42801.5, 42804)

REVOLVING FUNDS (continued)

The Board may at any time reduce or discontinue the revolving cash fund. (Education Code 42805)

No funds maintained in a revolving fund shall be used in an attempt to influence government decisions, for entertainment purposes, or for any other purpose not related to classroom instruction. (Education Code 42810)

The Board shall name the administrators who will have use and control of the funds. Officials so named shall be responsible for all payments into the accounts as well as expenditures from the accounts, subject to restrictions established by the Board.

INVENTORIES

In order to provide for the proper control and conservation of district property, the Superintendent or designee shall maintain an inventory of equipment in accordance with law for the following:

- 1. All items currently valued in excess of \$500 (Education Code 35168)
- 2. All items purchased with federal funds that have a useful life of more than one year with an acquisition cost per unit of \$5,000 or more (34 CFR 80.3)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain an inventory of all property. The following information must be recorded: (Education Code 35168)

- 1. Name and description of the property
- 2. Name of titleholder
- 3. Serial number or other identification number
- 4. Cost of the property (a reasonable estimate may be used if original cost is unknown)
- 5. Acquisition date
- 6. Location of use
- 7. Any ultimate disposition data including the date and method of disposal and sale price

The following information must also be recorded for items acquired with federal funds: (34 CFR 80.32)

- 1. Source of the property (funding source)
- 2. Titleholder
- 3. Percentage of federal participation in the cost of the property
- 4. Use and condition of property
- 5. Sale price of the property upon disposition and method used to determine current fair market value

INVENTORIES (continued)

At the time of purchase, the Superintendent or designee shall affix a label to the equipment containing the identification number and the district name. Equipment items purchased with categorical program funds shall also be labeled with the name of the project in accordance with 5 CCR 3946.

A copy of the inventory shall be kept at the district office and at the appropriate school site.

Physical Inventory

At least once every two years, a physical inventory shall be conducted and the results reconciled with the property records. (34 CFR 80.32)

Each school shall maintain a copy of its inventory and provide a copy of this inventory to the district office. Copies of all district inventories shall be kept at the district office.

TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

The Governing Board desires to offer a high-quality transitional kindergarten program for eligible children who do not yet meet the minimum age criterion for kindergarten. The program shall assist children in developing the academic, social, and emotional skills they need to succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

The district's transitional kindergarten shall be the first year of a two-year kindergarten program. (Education Code 48000)

The Board encourages ongoing collaboration among district preschool staff, other preschool providers, elementary teachers, administrators, and parents/guardians in program development, implementation, and evaluation.

The district's transitional kindergarten program shall admit children whose fifth birthday lies between: (Education Code 48000)

- 1. November 2 and December 2 in the 2012-13 school year
- 2. October 2 and December 2 in the 2013-14 school year
- 3. September 2 and December 2 in the 2014-15 school year and each school year thereafter

Parents/guardians of eligible children shall be notified of the availability of this program and the age, residency, and any other enrollment requirements. Enrollment in the transitional kindergarten program shall be voluntary.

Curriculum and Instruction

The district's transitional kindergarten program shall be based on a modified kindergarten curriculum that is age and developmentally appropriate. (Education Code 48000)

Staffing

Teachers assigned to teach in transitional kindergarten classes shall possess a teaching credential or permit that authorizes instruction at the kindergarten grade level.

Continuation to Kindergarten

Students who complete the transitional kindergarten program shall be eligible to continue in kindergarten the following school year. Parents/guardians of such students shall not be required to submit a signed parental permission form for kindergarten attendance.

A student shall not attend more than two years in a combination of transitional kindergarten and kindergarten. (Education Code 46300)

The Superintendent or designee shall develop or identify appropriate assessments of transitional kindergarten students' development and progress.
