Due to shortfall of revenue generated by Level 1 Statutory Development Fees and the recent difficulty to qualify to collect Level 2 Statutory Developer Fees through the School Facility Needs analysis, the District is unable to fully fund the construction of new facilities within new developments. The District has been in the process of negotiating School Facilities Agreements with developers to provide additional funding sources for school construction. Specifically with the larger villages coming on board as well as the special use district. This is going to be similar to Village 1 and Village 5 with a couple changes. This will be a smaller plan north of 65 and east of Nelson Lane. Over all

this is going to be a 430 unit project. We have negotiated an agreement with both developers and have come to a negotiated rate of \$5.50 per square foot with a cap of \$12,000 per unit.

8.4 Information/ Page 119 - 2018-2019 SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENT (SBAC) RESULTS - Leehane (19-20 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)

Kerry Callahan introduced Kathleen Leehane and stated that the information is very positive and exciting. Ms. Leehane presented a slide show of the student testing results. English information for the last 5 years shows trending up scores for grade 3-5. Secondary also shows a trending up pattern. 11th grade had a bit of a drop so the High School will be focusing on the data and work on what they can do to increase scores. A review of sub group comparisons showed all have increased. Ms. Leehane explained the English Learner scores and Reclassified English Learners. Regarding math, we tend to score lower in Math than English. However, this is the first year that 3rd grade Math scores are higher than 3rd grade English. Elementary grades 3-5th have an upward trend in scores. Secondary grades 6th -7th are also trending up, 8th grade is static. This year, 11th grade math 3 is trending up. We are higher in our scores than we were five years ago. We are closing the achievement gap and making some significant gains in math with some of the groups that have struggled in the past. We have middle school credentialed math teachers that are able to teach the difficult concepts to our students. Our comparison to Placer County Schools for the past 5 years show us improving our scores in comparison to other Placer

County Schools. As the years have progressed, we are slowly catching up with our English scores. The District is 10% above the entire stated and 4% below Placer County Schools for English Score 3 or higher. Our math scores have increased over the last two years and we are almost caught up to the Placer County Schools scores.

Mr. Carras stated that the scores are very impressive and great job in increasing scores in comparison to the Placer County Schools. He stated that we are compared to schools with significant differences in socioeconomic backgrounds. Mr. Carras congratulated Tim Allen and Gus Gomez for all they do for our students.

Mr. Haley stated that it is nice to see that we are lifting everybody together and we are not really having any group that is being left behind and that is the right way to run a school.

Mr. Armitage stated that Math 3 is very difficult and so the scores are very impressive.

School Being Featured: Sheridan Elementary School

Emily Ortiz, Sheridan Elementary School Principal introduced Teacher Maggie Mechanick. Mrs. Mechanick stated she is the 4/5 grade teacher at Sheridan Elementary and that as part of the AVID program at Sheridan they had students

prepare a google slide show regarding a College or Trade School that they are interested in. They talked about how to choose a college or trade school and what their interest are. She has students who are interested in becoming veterinarians, so they choose UC Davis. Other students are interested in cosmetology so they are looking at beauty schools. Mrs. Ortiz introduced student Henry Bockmann who created a slide show for UC Santa Cruz. Henry's presentation included the school colors, mascot and their logo. His presentation also included the cost of attendance and fun facts about the school. Fun facts included the mascot, a banana slug, it is near the boardwalk where there are lots of restaurants and things to do near the school. Henrys had several slide that listed the information he discussed during his presentation.

Mrs. Sisk the AVID 2/3 grade teacher talked about the AVID program at Sheridan and discussed college bound choices for students and other careers available to students that don't require college attendance. Mrs. Sisk stated that the College and Career Readiness Program with AVID at Sheridan Elementary introduces students to different professions. Mrs. Sisk presented a slide show that focused on the types of questions they ask students like "what we want to be as adults" and they discuss what it takes to get there. Mrs. Sisk stated that Sheridan has guest speakers come to the school to present to students about their own careers. Recently they had an author, Stephanie Berger from Lincoln come to speak to the students where she talked to the students about how her life experiences led her to become an author. They also had Cal Fire – Fire Captain Nelson and his crew come out and speak to the students and he explained fire safety and shared with the students why he became a fire fighter and what is required to become a fire fighter, which includes two years of school. They will have future speakers come to Sheridan which will include a dentist, you tuber, filmmaker, computer technician, accountant, mom and dad, hairstylist and a newspaper columnist. The community has become very involved with the AVID program and parents have become more involved as well. She stated that they would love to have the Board members attend as speakers and share their careers with the students. Mrs. Sisk thanked Kathleen for introducing the AVID program to Sheridan and thanked the Board for supporting the school and the programs at the school

Mrs. Ortiz introduced the Assistance League Greater Placer County representatives who discussed the program and their donation of \$1250 to Sheridan to assist them in purchasing books for the school. Amy Ridgeway had a question about the calendar and asked if there was any parent input for the calendar. Mr. Leaman explained that there is no parent input on the calendar but that there are many employees/teachers who are parents and have students in the district. Mrs. Ridgeway stated that it is hard to be a non-district working parent and have a 5 day weekend fall in October when you are not prepared for childcare. Mr. Leaman explained that it is a collaborative effort with a committee of staff members. She stated that minimum days for elementary as opposed to high school students is also very difficult for working parents. She has spoken to other parents about this and the schedule appears to be choppy and would like to find ways to help parents for planning purposes. Gabe Simon further explained the process of the calendar committee. There are 700 employees and it is quite difficult to come up with a calendar but it is voted on by the staff after several reviews and suggestions by the committee. Mrs. Ridgeway wanted to know if there was a way to include input from parents as part of the calendar process in the future. Mr. Simon and Mr. Leaman stated that they would review her concerns further.

Motion by Mr. Haley and seconded by Mrs. Long and passed by a 5-0 (*Ayes: Armitage, Carras, Haley, Long, Wyatt No: None*) vote to approve the revised calendar for the 2020-2021 school year

9.3 Information Page 51 – <u>2020-2023 LCAP PROCESS</u> – Callahan (19-20 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)

Kerry Callahan updated the process and changes to the LCAP process. Mrs. Callahan provided a handout with information that was provided to School Districts from the State. The handout included the State Priorities which are Conditions of Learning, Pupil Outcomes and Engagement, and are areas that must be addressed in the LCAP. Mr. Haley asked if the budget needs to be attached to each of the State Priorities listed. Mrs. Callahan stated that every dollar of the supplemental funds needs to be justified and attached. Mrs. Callahan stated that when writing the LCAP, they need to show how the funds given are used to help close the achievement gap. Mrs. Callahan stated that we have spent funds on the AVID program and our AVID students are out preforming other students in SBAC testing. information on the handouts included the CA Dashboard Performance Indicators/Metrics which are Conditions & Climate. Performance and Academic Engagement. Our current LCAP Goals include six items under the Academic Achievement, and Culture and Climate categories. We found these items to be redundant so we have condensed these goals to one item under each category. Under Academic Achievement, we have "All students will graduate from high school college and career ready". Under Culture and Climate we have listed "All students and families will be actively engaged in learning and in their school communities". Mrs. Callahan stated that this will lead to a more condensed LCAP with a new template but still have all the necessary information listed.

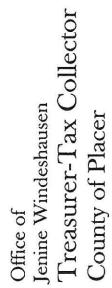
BACKGROUND:

PREFACE

Placer County Treasurer's Pooled Investment Report

For the purpose of clarity the following glossary of investment terms has been provided.

Book Value is the purchase price of a security plus amortization of any premium or discount. This may be more or less than face value, depending upon whether the security was purchased at a premium or at a discount.

Par Value is the principal amount of a security and the amount of principal that will be paid at maturity.

Market Value is the value at which a security can be sold at the time it is priced or the need to sell arises.

Market values are only relevant if the investment is sold prior to maturity. Profit or loss would be realized only if the specific investment were to be sold.

Government Code 53646 Compliance Report

The following information is a monthly update of funds on deposit in the Placer County Treasury pursuant to California Government code Section 53646. Further details of individual investments are included in the Treasurer's Monthly Investment Report. All investment transactions and decisions have been made with full compliance with California Government Code and Placer County's Statement of Investment Policy.

Individual securities are priced at the end of each month by Wells Fargo Bank.

The Weighted Average Maturity of the investments with the Treasury is 866 days.

The ability of the Placer County Treasury to meet its cash flow needs is demonstrated by \$535,388,882.25 in cash and investments maturing in the next 180 days.

PREFACE

Placer County Treasurer's Pooled Investment Report

For the purpose of clarity the following glossary of investment terms has been provided.

Book Value is the purchase price of a security plus amortization of any premium or discount. This may be more or less than face value, depending upon whether the security was purchased at a premium or at a discount.

Par Value is the principal amount of a security and the amount of principal that will be paid at maturity.

Market Value is the value at which a security can be sold at the time it is priced or the need to sell arises.

Market values are only relevant if the investment is sold prior to maturity. Profit or loss would be realized only if the specific investment were to be sold.

Government Code 53646 Compliance Report

The following information is a monthly update of funds on deposit in the Placer County Treasury pursuant to California Government code Section 53646. Further details of individual investments are included in the Treasurer's Monthly Investment Report. All investment transactions and decisions have been made with full compliance with California Government Code and Placer County's Statement of Investment Policy.

Individual securities are priced at the end of each month by Wells Fargo Bank.

The Weighted Average Maturity of the investments with the Treasury is 930 days.

The ability of the Placer County Treasury to meet its cash flow needs is demonstrated by \$474,725,255.23 in cash and investments maturing in the next 180 days.

PREFACE

Placer County Treasurer's Pooled Investment Report

August 31, 2019

For the purpose of clarity the following glossary of investment terms has been provided.

Book Value is the purchase price of a security plus amortization of any premium or discount. This may be more or less than face value, depending upon whether the security was purchased at a premium or at a discount.

Par Value is the principal amount of a security and the amount of principal that will be paid at maturity.

Market Value is the value at which a security can be sold at the time it is priced or the need to sell arises.

Market values are only relevant if the investment is sold prior to maturity. Profit or loss would be realized only if the specific investment were to be sold.

Government Code 53646 Compliance Report

The following information is a monthly update of funds on deposit in the Placer County Treasury pursuant to California Government code Section 53646. Further details of individual investments are included in the Treasurer's Monthly Investment Report. All investment transactions and decisions have been made with full compliance with California Government Code and Placer County's Statement of Investment Policy.

Individual securities are priced at the end of each month by Wells Fargo Bank.

The Weighted Average Maturity of the investments with the Treasury is 969 days.

The ability of the Placer County Treasury to meet its cash flow needs is demonstrated by \$445,393,283.60 in cash and investments maturing in the next 180 days.

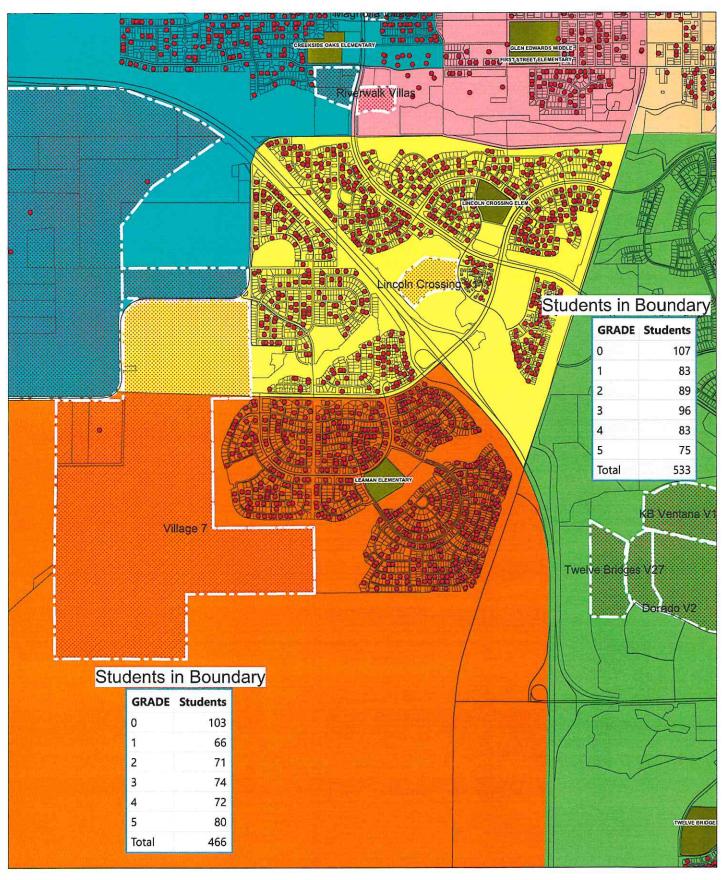

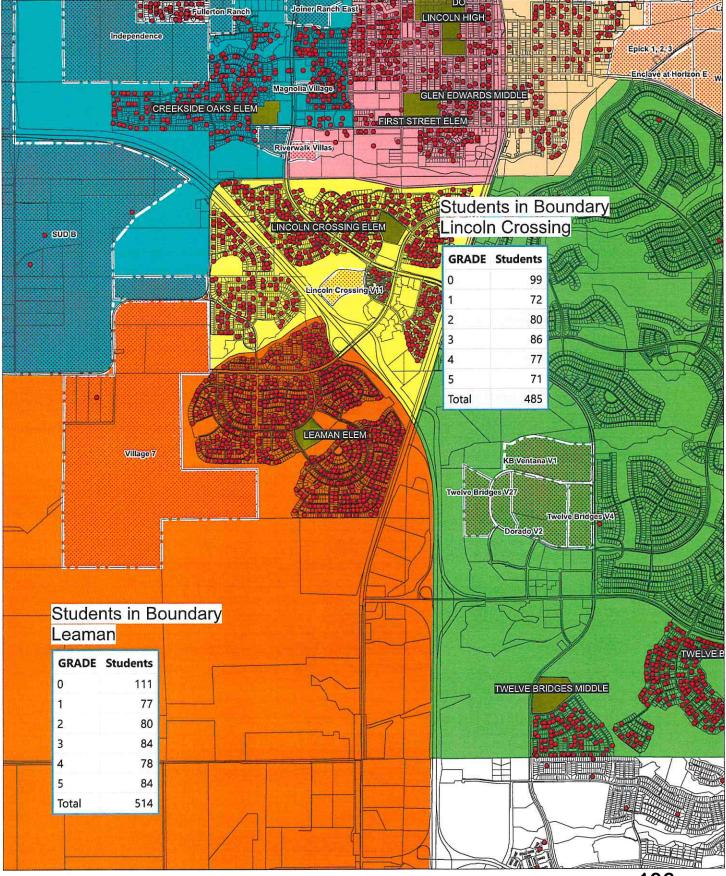

Policy updated to reflect court decisions clarifying the distinction between probationary employees and temporary employees. Material regarding eligibility for permanent status based on average daily attendance moved from AR to BP, except option for not granting permanent status deleted, as this option was only applicable to districts with less than 250 average daily attendance and the remainder of this policy and regulation is for use only by districts that grant permanent status. Policy also adds material regarding the notification of nonreelection of a probationary employee, formerly in AR 4117.6 - Decision Not to Rehire. Regulation updated to add material regarding the computation of the length of service required for classification as a permanent employee, including types of service excluded from that computation.

Policy and regulation updated to reflect procedural rights that must be granted to permanent district employees based on the court decision in *Skelly v. State Personnel Board*, including notification of the materials upon which the proposed action is based and the employee's right to respond to a designated district official ("Skelly officer") who will decide whether the recommended discipline should be imposed.

Certificated Personnel BP 4116(a)

PROBATIONARY/PERMANENT STATUS

Probationary Status

The Governing Board of Trustees desires to employ and retain highly qualified certificated personnel to implement the district's educational program. Newly hired certificated personnel shall serve a probationary period during which the Board shall determine their suitability for long-term district employment.

Certificated employees who satisfactorily complete the probationary period shall be granted permanent status.

A probationary teacher employee who has been employed by the district in a position(s) or positions requiring certification for two complete consecutive school years and is then rehired reelected for the next succeeding school year shall become a permanent employee at the beginning of the third year. (Education Code 44929.21, 44929.23)

During the probationary period, Probationary employees shall receive training professional development and, assistance and evaluations consistent with their needs as new teachers. Such training and assistance which may consist of inservice training and/or meetings with the employee's evaluator to discuss areas of strength and areas requiring improvement. Inservice training may be provided during school hours as part of a comprehensive staff development program.

The performance of each probationary employee shall be evaluated and assessed at least once every school year.

Dismissal/Nonreelection of Probationary Employees

During the school year, a probationary employee may be suspended or dismissed only for cause and in accordance with district procedures. (Education Code 44948.3)

With proper notice, the Board may, without cause, elect not to reemploy a probationary employee for the subsequent year. (Education Code 44929.21, 44929.23)

The Superintendent or designee shall annually provide the Board with recommendations regarding the reelection or nonreelection of probationary certificated personnel for the ensuing school year.

At any time during a probationary employee's first year of employment in the district, the Board may give written notice to the employee of the Board's decision not to reelect the employee for a second school year. If the Board does not give written notice, the employee shall be deemed reelected for the next succeeding school year.

During the final year of the probationary period, the Board may decide not to reelect the employee for the following year, and shall so notify the employee in writing on or before March 15. If the Board does not give written notice on or before March 15, the employee shall be deemed reelected for the next succeeding school year. (Education Code 44929.21, 44948.5)

Such notices shall be delivered through personal service upon the employee, certified mail with return receipt, email, or another method which documents actual receipt of the notice by the employee.

Permanent Status

Granting of permanent status shall be based on completion of the probationary period in accordance with applicable law. Employees granted permanent status acquire specific rights under the Education Code, including those relating to discipline and dismissal. (Education Code 44932-44988)

Permanent Status

A probationary teacher who has been employed by the district in a position or positions requiring certification for two complete consecutive school years and is then rehired for the next succeeding school year shall become a permanent employee at the beginning of the third year. (Education Code 44929.21)

Eligibility for Permanent Status

A probationary employee who, in any one school year, has served for at least 75 percent of the number of days maintained by regular district schools shall be deemed to have served a complete school year. (Education Code 44908)

The following shall not be included for purposes of computing the service required as a prerequisite to classification as a permanent employee:

- 1. Service as an instructor in classes conducted at regional occupational centers or programs (Education Code 44910)
- 2. Service under a provisional credential other than a one-year emergency credential (Education Code 44911)
- 3. Service only as a teacher of basic military drill in high school cadet companies (Education Code 44912)
- 4. Employment in summer school (Education Code

Permanency Achieved in Other Districts

A person who has achieved permanent status as a certificated employee in another school district may be employed by the **Governing** Board **of Trustees** as a permanent certificated employee. (Education Code 44929.28)

Interns

A person employed as a district or university intern shall be classified as a probationary employee. Following completion of the internship, if he/she is reelected by the district to serve in a position requiring certification qualifications for the next succeeding school year, he/she the employee shall continue to be classified as a probationary employee during that year. DISMISSAL/SUSPENSION/DISCIPLINARY ACTION

The Board of Trustees expects all employees to perform their jobs satisfactorily and to exhibit professional and appropriate conduct. A classified employee may be disciplined for unprofessional conduct or unsatisfactory performance in accordance with law or any applicable collective bargaining agreement, Board policy, and or administrative regulation.

Disciplinary actions shall be based on the particular facts and circumstances involved and the severity of the employee's conduct or performance. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that disciplinary actions are taken in a consistent, nondiscriminatory manner and are appropriately documented.

Disciplinary actions may include, but are not limited to, verbal and written warnings, involuntary reassignment, demotion, suspension without pay, reduction of pay step in class, compulsory leave, and dismissal.

A probationary classified employee may be dismissed by the Superintendent or designee at any time prior to the expiration of the probationary period.

Permanent classified employees shall be subject to disciplinary action only for cause as specified in the accompanying administrative regulation. (Education Code 45113)

Procedures for Serious Disciplinary Proceedings

The Superintendent or designee shall develop disciplinary procedures for use when dismissal, suspension, demotion, involuntary reassignment, or other serious disciplinary action is contemplated against an employee. The procedures for such discipline shall include an opportunity for an employee for whom any such disciplinary action is recommended to meet with, or respond in writing to, a designated district official ("Skelly officer") who will determine whether the recommended discipline should proceed further or be modified or withdrawn.

If a permanent classified employee receives a notice from the Superintendent or designee of a recommended suspension, demotion, involuntary reassignment, or dismissal, the employee may request a Board hearing on the matter.

After meeting with the employee or considering the employee's written response, if the Skelly officer determines that the recommended discipline should proceed, the Superintendent or designee shall send the employee a notice of the recommended disciplinary action, a statement of charges, and the results of the Skelly hearing. The notice shall include a statement advising the employee of the right to request a Board hearing on the matter.

If the employee fails to request a hearing within the time specified in the notice, the employee is deemed to have waived the right to do so, and the Board may order the recommended disciplinary action into effect immediately.

If a timely request is submitted, a hearing shall be conducted by the Board, except that, if the matter involves an allegation of egregious misconduct as defined in Education Code 44932 and involves a minor, the matter shall be referred to an administrative law judge to determine whether sufficient cause exists for disciplinary action against the employee. (Education Code 45113, 45312)

The hearing shall be held at the earliest convenient date, taking into consideration the established schedule of the Board and the availability of legal counsel and witnesses. The employee shall be notified of the time and place of the hearing.

The hearing shall be held in closed session, unless the employee requests that the matter be heard in an open session meeting. (Government Code 54957)

The employee shall be entitled to appear personally, produce evidence, and be represented by legal counsel.

The Board may use the services of its legal counsel in ruling upon procedural questions, objections to evidence, and issues of law. The Board may review and consider the records of any prior personnel action proceedings against the employee in which a disciplinary action was ultimately sustained and any records contained in the employee's personnel files and introduced into evidence at the hearing. The Board shall not be bound by rules of evidence used in California courts. Informality in any such hearing shall not invalidate any order or decision made by the Board.

At any time before a matter is submitted to the Board for decision, the Superintendent or designee may, with the consent of the Board, serve on the employee and file with the Board an amended or supplemental recommendation of disciplinary action. If the amended or supplemental

recommendation includes new causes or allegations, the employee shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to prepare a defense. Any new causes or allegations shall be deemed controverted and any objections to the amended or supplemental causes or allegation may be made orally at the hearing and shall be noted on the record.

Following the hearing or, if the employee has not requested a hearing, after reviewing the Superintendent or designee's recommendation for disciplinary action, the Board shall affirm, modify, or reject the recommended disciplinary action recommended by the Superintendent or designee. The decision of the Board shall be in writing and shall contain findings of fact and the disciplinary action approved, if any. The decision of the Board shall be final.

Within 10 working days of the Board's final decision, a copy of the decision shall be delivered to the employee and/or designated representative personally or by registered mail.

In lieu of holding a Board hearing on the sufficiency of the causes for disciplinary action, the Board may delegate its authority to an impartial third-party hearing officer. When the matter is heard by a third-party hearing officer, the Board retains the authority to review the determination and to adopt or reject the recommended decision. (Education Code 45113)

If the matter involves an allegation of egregious misconduct as defined in Education Code 44932 and involves a minor, the matter shall be referred to an administrative law judge to determine whether sufficient cause exists for disciplinary action against the employee. In **such** cases involving an allegation of egregious misconduct, the ruling of the administrative law judge shall be binding on the district and the employee. (Education Code 45113)

DISMISSAL/SUSPENSION/DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Causes for Disciplinary Action

A permanent classified employee may be subject to suspension, demotion, involuntary reassignment, or dismissal for one or more of the following causes:

1. Immoral conduct, including, but not limited to, egregious misconduct that is the basis for a sex offense as defined in Education Code 44010, a controlled substance offense as defined in Education Code 44011, or child abuse and neglect as described in Penal Code 11165.2-11165.6

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14. A physical or mental condition which precludes the employee from the proper performance of duties and responsibilities as determined by competent medical authority, except as otherwise provided by a contract or by law

An employee shall not be suspended, disciplined, reassigned, transferred, dismissed, or otherwise retaliated against solely for acting to protect a student, or for refusing to infringe on a student's protected conduct, when that student is exercising free speech or press rights pursuant to Education Code 48907 or 48950. (Education Code 48907, 48950)

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No disciplinary action shall be taken for any cause which arose before the employee became permanent, nor for any cause which arose more than two years before the date of the filing of the notice of cause unless this cause was concealed or not disclosed by the employee when it could be reasonably assumed that the employee would have disclosed the facts to the district. (Education Code 45113)

Initiation and Notification of Charges

The Superintendent or designee shall provide notice to the employee of a recommendation for discipline, which includes the charges and materials upon which the recommendation is based. The notification shall identify an impartial district official ("Skelly officer") with whom the employee may meet at a specified time and place or to whom the employee may provide a written response to the recommendation of discipline. After meeting with the employee or considering any response from the employee, the Skelly officer shall recommend to the Superintendent or designee whether to proceed with the recommendation for discipline.

The Superintendent or designee shall file any **final** recommendation for a disciplinary action in writing with the Governing Board. A copy of the recommendation shall be served upon the employee either personally or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, at the employee's last known address.

The notice shall, in ordinary and concise language, inform the employee of the specific charge(s) or cause(s) for the disciplinary action, the specific acts and omissions upon which the action is based, and, if applicable, the district rule or regulation that the employee has allegedly violated. In addition, the notice shall include the employee's right to a hearing on those charges, the time within which the hearing may be requested which shall be not less than five days after service of the notice to the employee, and a card or paper which the employee may sign and file to deny the charges and request a hearing. (Education Code 45113, 45116)

Request for Board Hearing

Within the time specified in the notice of the recommendation of disciplinary action, the employee may request a hearing on the charges by signing and filing the card or paper included with the notice. (Education Code 45113)

Any other written document signed and appropriately filed within the specified time limit by the employee shall constitute a sufficient notice of the request for a hearing. The request shall be delivered to the office of the Superintendent or designee during normal work hours of that office. If mailed to the office of the Superintendent or designee, it must be received or postmarked no later than the time limit specified by the district. In cases where an order of suspension without pay has been issued in conjunction with a recommendation of dismissal, any request for a hearing on the dismissal shall also constitute a request to hear the suspension order, and the necessity of the suspension order shall be an issue in the hearing.

Employment Status Pending a Hearing

A classified employee against whom a recommendation of disciplinary action has been issued shall remain on active duty status pending any hearing on the charges, unless the Superintendent or designee determines that the employee's continuance in active duty status would present an unreasonable risk of harm to students, staff, or property. The Superintendent or designee may, in writing, order the employee immediately suspended from duty without pay and shall state the reasons that the suspension is deemed necessary. The suspension order shall be served upon the employee either personally or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, immediately after issuance

Compulsory Leave of Absence

Upon being informed by law enforcement that a classified employee has been charged with a "mandatory leave of absence offense," the Superintendent or designee shall immediately place the employee on a leave of absence. A mandatory leave of absence offense includes:

- 1. Any sex offense as defined in Education Code 44010
- 2. Violation or attempted violation of Penal Code 187 (murder or attempted murder)
- 3. Any offense involving the unlawful sale, use, or exchange to minors of controlled substances as listed in Health and Safety Code 11054, 11055, and 11056

The Superintendent or designee may place on an immediate compulsory leave of absence a classified employee who is charged with an "optional leave of absence offense," defined as a controlled substance offense specified in Education Code 44011 and Health and Safety Code 11357-11361, 11363, 11364, and 11370.1 except as it relates to marijuana, mescaline, peyote, or tetrahydrocannabinols.

An employee's compulsory leave for a mandatory or optional leave of absence offense may extend for not more than 10 days after the entry of judgment in the criminal proceedings. However, the compulsory leave may be extended if the Board gives notice, within 10 days after the entry of judgment in the proceedings, that the employee will be dismissed within 30 days from the date of service of the notice unless the employee demands a hearing on the dismissal.
