


For students who turn 5 on or before Sept 1

All Classes are Extended Day (8:10 - 1:40)

Bilingual Immersion (Spanish/English)

Parents will select their preference as part of the registration process. This does not guarantee placement in any of the options above.

Bilingual Immersion is a District program, housed at Creekside Oaks Elementary, but is open for all students in WPUSD.



Extended Day Kinder

- 8:00 1:40
- Lunch time is provided (30-40 min)
- Students will have more time to
 - Develop appropriate social skills
 - Extend academic learning
 - Be exposed to more literacy

Bilingual Immersion

- Bilingual Immersion is a form of bilingual education in which students are taught literacy and content in two languages.
- Classes are comprised of at least one-third native
 Spanish speakers and at least one-third native
 English speakers (may not be the case to start for WPUSD)
- Bilingual Immersion programs foster bilingualism, biliteracy, enhanced awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity, and high levels of academic achievement through instruction in two languages.



RESEARCH

Why is this good for kids?

There are, without doubt, many benefits—for students and society—that come from having command of more than one language, and from the interaction between cultures that language learning brings.

Developing proficiency in more than one language **enhances career opportunities**, **promotes cross-cultural understanding**, and **improves communication skills** (Tochon, 2009; Rumbaut, 2014).

Students benefit cognitively as well; numerous studies have shown the cognitive benefits associated with bilingualism (Esposito & Baker-Ward, 2013; Ball, 2010; Espinosa, 2013; Sandhofer & Uchikoshi, 2013; Barac et al., 2014).

Instruction


Instructional model:

- 90:10 (see image)
 - Significantly more instruction time in Spanish in earlier grades, with instruction time in English increasing each year until instruction in both languages is equal
 - Instruction is 90% in Spanish for Kindergarten and 1st grade. Generally the whole class time is in Spanish, not English.
 - Students learn to read and write in Spanish first. These skills will transfer and develop their English reading and writing skills.
 - Students will receive phonics instruction in English starting in 2nd grade. By 3rd grade generally students will be able to read in both languages.

Grade	Instruction Time - Spanish -	Instruction Time - English -
K/1	90%	10%
2	80%	20%
3	70%	30%
4	60%	40%
5	50%	50%

Bilingual Immersion for 2022-2023

- Two Kindergarten Classes
- Extended Day Schedule (8:10 1:40)
- Located at Creekside Oaks Elementary
- Program will progress as students move through the grades
- Student placement will be determined by a lottery (held February 24)
 - Your completed registration packet must be turned in to your child's home school by 4:00 pm on February 19 to be eligible for the lottery
- Students not selected will be placed on a waitlist and will be eligible for enrollment through the middle of 1st grade as space permits
- Priority given to students with siblings in the program!



Bilingual Immersion Program Goals

- x Extend the program to include Middle School classes at 50/50 English/Spanish
- x High School Sophomores qualify for AP Spanish Exams
- x Provide additional high school courses to further develop Spanish language skills
- x Expand the elementary program to more classes
- x Students participate in the program through high school

Our Bilingual Immersion Teachers


Mariela Ochoa (1)
