RE: Program Improvement Status

September 12, 2003

Glen Edwards Middle School respectfully requests that it be disincluded from the list of schools targeted for School Improvement because of not meeting its Adequate Yearly Progress. We believe we have met our AYP, based on the following points, which are clearly delineated and supported.

- 1. In 2002, Glen Edwards Middle School showed an overall growth of 27 points in its API, greatly surpassing its target growth of 7 points, but missing meeting its API by only one point in one subgroup - socioeconomically disadvantaged. (See Attachment 1) For purposes of current AYP legislation, we needed to show 16% of the 264 students in this subgroup (42 students) achieved a "proficient" score or better in mathematics and 13.6% (36 students) achieved a "proficient" score or better in language arts. We met our language arts target. Our mathematics reported results showed 40 students met that subgroup criteria, missing the target by two students. (40/264 = 15.1%) (See Attachment 2) In reviewing the data, however, we find the demographics for four students who were on the free and reduced lunch program and who scored "proficient" in their CA Standards results did not indicate they qualified for free and reduced lunch and thereby were not counted toward that subgroup's results. Had they been properly identified, their results would have boosted that subgroup API by the one point needed to make both the required subgroup API growth (thereby qualifying the school for overall positive API status) and the current AYP mathematics requirement (44/268 = 16.4%). Those students are:
 - Student 2002 A- Grade 6 Proficient Mathematics
 - Student 2002 B Grade 6 Proficient Mathematics
 - Student 2002 C Grade 6 Proficient Mathematics
 - Student 2002 D Grade 6 Proficient Mathematics

2. In 2003, in the area of socio-economically disadvantaged students, the school is credited with testing 288/306 students in language arts (94%) and 285/306 students in mathematics (93%). (See Attachment 4) Glen Edwards Middle School made every effort to test all students in order to comply with federal regulations requiring testing of 95% of students in each subgroup. However, parents of several students refused to allow their children to be tested. (See Attachment 5 - 10)

In one situation, (Attachment 5, 2003 Students A, B & C) the parent of three siblings at the school who qualified for free and reduced lunch refused to allow testing of her children, citing reasons of racial bias in the testing.

In three other cases (Attachment 6, 2003 Students D, E & F), parents of students on individual education plans refused to allow testing of their Special Day Class or Resource Specialist Program students, all of whom also qualified for free and reduced lunches. In these situations, the California State Education Code was followed by the school, which requires schools to allow parents to opt their children out of testing. This conflict between federal expectations and state regulations obviously creates a great difficulty for the school, when we are attempting to conform to federal regulations to test all students.

In another situation, a socio-economically disadvantaged student who was suspended pending expulsion was not available for testing. (Attachment 7, 2003 Student G).

In another case, a student's expulsion began the first day of testing, April 28, 2003. (Attachment 8, 2003 Student H). That student's test was incorrectly coded to state the student was absent for the entire testing period. In fact, the student was not enrolled as of the first day of testing (April 28) and a test document should not have been submitted for the student.

In yet another situation, a student was critically ill and not available to test (Attachment 9, 2003 Student I).


In a final situation, a student's mother had just died and his father requested he not be put through the rigor of testing (Attachment 10, Student J).

In summary, one socio-economically disadvantaged student was not enrolled the first day of testing (Student H) and should not have been counted in the results; the other nine students, had they tested, would have allowed Glen Edwards Middle School to meet the required 95% participation criteria in the subgroup of socio-economically disadvantaged students, with 297/305 (97%) testing in language arts and 294/305 (96%) testing in math. (Another way to look at the data is to eliminate these students from the counts entirely, again yielding 288/296 or 97% participation in language arts and 285/296 or 96% participation in mathematics.)

It merits mention that socio-economically disadvantaged students at Glen Edwards Middle School more than met the AYP targets of 13.6% proficient in language arts and 16% proficient in mathematics. At Glen Edwards, 21.6% of our socio-economically disadvantaged students are proficient in language arts and 23.2% are proficient in mathematics. The school has obviously taken the charge of raising its participation rate and its achievement rates of socio-economically disadvantaged students seriously.

In summary, Glen Edwards Middle School has been identified for Program Improvement Status because of failing to meet its overall API status in 2002, for not meeting a 16% proficiency rating for socio-economically disadvantaged students in mathematics for 2002, and for not showing a 95% participation rate of socio-economically disadvantaged students testing in 2003. Through this appeal, we have shown conclusively that Glen Edwards Middle School met its targets of proficiency for socio-economically disadvantaged students in both mathematics and language arts for 2002, and was kept from meeting its participation rates for socio-economically disadvantaged students in 2003 due to a conflict between state and federal law and other extenuating circumstances. We have shown without question that Glen Edwards Middle School has made a tremendous overall improvement in its API scores, has greatly improved the achievement of its socioeconomically disadvantaged students by far surpassing required proficiency rates in the latest 2003 testing despite having 40 more students qualifying for this subgroup in the current testing year, and has complied with state and federal regulations to the best of its ability, testing more than 95% of students in this subgroup when adjusting for circumstances beyond the school's control. Therefore, we respectfully request that Glen Edwards Middle School be removed from the list of schools currently targeted for school improvement.







This resolution authorizes the District to conduct a land-owner election to determine if the Stage Coach Run subdivision will be annexed into the Community Facilities District.

RESOLUTION NO. 03/04.09

A RESOLUTION CALLING AN ELECTION TO SUBMIT THE QUESTION OF LEVYING A SPECIAL TAX WITHIN THE AREA PROPOSED TO BE ANNEXED TO COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 1 TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Western Placer Unified School District (the "District") on December 9, 1991, approved Resolution No. 91/91.23 establishing Western Placer Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1 ("CFD No. 1") pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended (the "Act"), being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California, for the purpose of providing for the financing of the construction and acquisition of certain public school facilities (the "Facilities") described in Exhibit A thereto;

WHEREAS, at an election held on January 7, 1992, more than two-thirds of the votes cast were in favor of the levy of a special tax, the establishment of an appropriations limit, and the incurrence of bonded indebtedness, all as determined by the Board in Resolution No. 91/92.28, duly adopted on January 7, 1992;

WHEREAS, the Board on August 5, 2003, duly adopted Resolution No. 03/04.04 declaring its intention to annex certain territory to CFD No. 1 and to levy a special tax within that territory to pay for certain public facilities;

WHEREAS, the territory proposed to be annexed is identified in a map entitled "Annexation Map #2003-2 of Community Facilities District No. 1991-1," a copy of which was recorded in Book 2 of Maps of Community Facilities Districts at Page 13-6 in the office of the County Recorder of Placer County;

WHEREAS, the Board convened a public hearing on Tuesday, September 16, 2003, at 7:00 p.m., at the Lincoln High School Performing Arts Building, 790 J Street, Lincoln, California, at which hearing all persons interested, including all taxpayers, property owners and registered voters within CFD No. 1 and the territory proposed to be annexed, were given an opportunity to appear and be heard on the proposed annexation of territory to CFD No. 1 and the levy of special taxes within the territory proposed to be annexed;

WHEREAS, written protests have not been filed by fifty percent (50%) or more the registered voters residing within CFD No. 1, or by fifty percent (50%) or more of the registered voters residing within the territory to be annexed, or by the owners of one-half (1/2) or more of the area within CFD No. 1, or by the owners of one-half (1/2) or more of the territory to be annexed;

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that there are fewer than twelve registered voters residing in the territory proposed to be annexed to CFD No. 1 and that the qualified electors in such territory are the landowners; and

WHEREAS, on the basis of all of the foregoing, the Board has determined to call an election to authorize the annexation of territory to CFD No. 1 and the levying of a special tax therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Western Placer Unified School District as follows:

- Section 1. Recitals. All of the above recitals are true and correct, and the Board so finds and determines.
- Section 2. Confirmation of Findings in Resolution of Intention. The Board reconfirms all of its findings and determinations as set forth in the Resolution of Intention.
- Section 3. Finding Regarding Protests. The Board finds and determines that written protests to the proposed annexation of territory to CFD No. 1 and the levy of the special tax within such territory are insufficient in number and in amount under the Act, and the Board hereby further orders and determines that all such protests are hereby overruled.
- Section 4. Finding Regarding Prior Proceedings. The Board finds and determines that all prior proceedings had and taken by the Board with respect to the annexation of territory to CFD No. 1 are valid and in conformity with the requirements of the Act.
- Section 5. Tax Lien. Upon recordation of an amended notice of special tax lien pursuant to Section 3114.5 of the Streets and Highways Code, a continuing lien to secure each levy of the special tax shall attach to all non-exempt real property in the territory proposed to be annexed and this lien shall continue in force and effect until the collection of the tax is terminated by the Board.
- Section 6. Call and Order of Election. The Board hereby calls and orders a special election to be held on Wednesday, September 24, 2003 ("election day"), at which election the question of levying the special tax within the territory proposed to be annexed shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the territory proposed to be annexed. The terms of the measure are described in this Resolution. The abbreviated statement of the ballot measure is set forth in Exhibit A and is incorporated herein by reference.
- Section 7. Vote Required. If the proposition on the question of levying the special tax within the territory proposed to be annexed receives the approval of more than two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast on the proposition, then the territory proposed to be annexed will be added to and become part of CFD No. 1 with full legal effect and the Board will be authorized to levy the special tax within the annexed territory.
- Section 8. Submission of Ballot Proposition. The Board hereby submits to the landowners within the territory proposed to be annexed to CFD No. 1 at the special election the ballot proposition set forth in Section 6 of this resolution. Pursuant to Government Code section 53327(b), the Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent to conduct the election.

- Section 9. Conduct of Election. The special election shall be held and conducted, the returns canvassed, and the results ascertained and determined, as herein provided:
- (a) All owners of land within the territory proposed to be annexed to CFD No. 1 upon the date of the special election shall be qualified to vote upon the measure submitted at the special election. Each landowner shall have one vote for each acre or portion thereof that she, he, or it owns within the territory proposed to be annexed to CFD No. 1, as provided in Government Code section 53326(b).
- (b) Pursuant to Government Code Section 53327, the special election shall be conducted as a mailed ballot election, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 1340 et seq. and Section 23511.1 of the Elections Code. There shall be no polling places for the special election.
- (c) The Superintendent is hereby directed to cause to be mailed to each landowner in the territory proposed to be annexed to CFD No. 1 a ballot in the form set forth in Exhibit A hereto, with return postage prepaid.
- (d) Each voter desiring to vote for the measure to levy a special tax shall mark an "X" in the voting square opposite the word "YES." To vote against the measure, the voter shall mark an "X" in the voting square opposite the word "NO."
- (e) The Superintendent shall accept the ballots of the landowners up to 4:00 p.m. on election day, whether the ballots be personally delivered or received by mail. Once all qualified electors have voted, the election shall be closed. The Superintendent shall have available ballots that may be marked at the Superintendent's office on election day by voters.
- (f) The Superintendent shall commence the canvass of the returns of the special election at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 24, 2003, at the Superintendent's office, and at the conclusion thereof shall declare the results of the election.
- (g) The Board shall declare the results of the special election at its next regular meeting after the certification of the election, and shall cause to be inserted into its minutes a statement of the results of the special election as ascertained by the canvass of returns.
- Section 10. General Authorization with Respect to the Election. RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF WESTERN PLACER UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CERTAIN AGREEMENTS AND DOCUMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CERTIFICATES OF PARTICIPATION ON BEHALF OF THE DISTRICT AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, the Western Placer Unified School District (the "District") is a member of a joint powers authority (the "Authority") formed pursuant to a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (the "JPA Agreement) to assist its Members (as defined in the JPA Agreement) in, among other things, financing working capital and financing or refinancing public capital improvements for school facilities;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interest of the District to construct and improve certain school facilities within the District;

WHEREAS, the JPA Agreement and the Act authorize the Authority to assist in the financing of Program Projects (as defined in the JPA Agreement) and the Authority will assist the District in connection with the execution and delivery of the District's Certificates of Participation (School Facilities Project), Series 2003B (the "Certificates") in the maximum aggregate amount of not to exceed \$[14,000,000] to finance the construction and improvement of such school facilities within the District;

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the execution and delivery of the Certificates by the Authority, the District and the Authority will enter into the Lease (as hereinafter defined) pursuant to which the District will lease certain real property currently located in the District and all facilities and improvements located thereon to be selected by the Superintendent of the District (the "Property") to the Authority;

WHEREAS, the District and the Authority will enter into the Sublease (as hereinafter defined) pursuant to which the Authority will sublease the Property to the District;

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Assignment Agreement (as hereinafter defined) the Authority will assign and transfer to U.S. Bank National Association (the "Trustee") all of its rights, title and interest in and to the Sublease and the Lease, including its right to receive payments of base rental under the Sublease;

WHEREAS, the Authority, the District and the Trustee will enter into a Second Supplemental Trust Agreement (as hereinafter defined) pursuant to which the Trustee will execute and deliver the Certificates;

WHEREAS, the District and Banc of America Securities LLC (the "Underwriter") will enter into the Purchase Agreement (as hereinafter defined) relating to the Certificates:

WHEREAS, the Authority, the District and Bank of America, N.A, or such other bank as may be approved by the Authority and the District (the "Bank") will enter into a Reimbursement Agreement (as hereinafter defined) pursuant to which the District will agree to reimburse the Bank for certain payments made by the Bank in connection with the Certificates;

WHEREAS, the District and Banc of America Securities LLC, as remarketing agent (the "Remarketing Agent") will enter into a Remarketing Agreement (as hereinafter defined) to provide for the remarketing of the Certificates; and

WHEREAS, there have been presented to this meeting the following:

- (i) A form of Lease Agreement (the "Lease") by and between the District and the Authority;
- (ii) A form of Sublease Agreement (the "Sublease") by and between the Authority and the District;
- (iii) A form of Assignment Agreement (the "Assignment Agreement") by and between the Authority and the Trustee;
- (iv) A form of Second Supplemental Trust Agreement (the "Second Supplemental") by and among the Authority, the District and the Trustee;
- (v) A form of Certificate Purchase Agreement (the "Purchase Agreement") by and between the District and the Underwriter;
- (vi) A form of Remarketing Agreement (the "Remarketing Agreement" by and between the District and the Remarketing Agent;
- (vii) A form of Reimbursement Agreement (the "Reimbursement Agreement") by and between the District and the Bank; and
- (viii) A form of official statement relating to the Certificates (the "Official Statement").

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board of Trustees of the District as follows:

SECTION 1. The District, as a Member of the Authority within whose boundaries the Program Projects are to be located, hereby approves the execution and delivery of the Certificates and hereby determines there will be significant public benefit resulting therefrom.

SECTION 2. The form of the Lease on file with the District and considered at this meeting is hereby approved. The officers and agents of the District are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver the Lease in substantially the form on file with the District and considered at this meeting, with such changes therein as the officers and agents of the District may approve, in their discretion, as being in the best interests of the District, including, without limitation, the property and facilities to be subject to such Lease and such changes as may be necessary to obtain credit enhancement, including bond insurance, with respect to the Certificates, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

The officers and agents of the District are hereby authorized and directed to make changes to the Lease to achieve the purposes for which the Certificates are being executed and delivered.

SECTION 3. The form of the Sublease on file with the District and considered at this meeting is hereby approved. The officers and agents of the District are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver the Sublease in substantially the form on file with the District and considered at this meeting, with such changes therein as the officers and agents of the District may approve, in their discretion, as being in the best interests of the District, including, without limitation, the property and facilities to be subject to such Sublease and such changes as may be necessary to obtain credit enhancement, including bond insurance, with respect to the Certificates, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof. The officers and agents of the District are hereby authorized and directed to make changes to the Sublease to achieve the purposes for which the Certificates are being executed and delivered.

SECTION 4. The District hereby consents to the assignment by the Authority pursuant to the Assignment Agreement of substantially all of its rights, title and interest under the Sublease and the Lease, including the right to receive payments of base rental under the Lease Agreement, to the Trustee for the benefit of the owners of the Certificates.

SECTION 5. The form of the Second Supplemental on file with the District and considered at this meeting is hereby approved. The officers and agents of the District are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver the Second Supplemental in substantially the form on file with the District and considered at this meeting, with such changes therein as the officers and agents of the District may approve, in their discretion, as being in the best interests of the District, including, without limitation, such changes as may be necessary to obtain credit enhancement, including bond insurance, with respect to the Certificates, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery of the Second Supplemental by such officers and agents. The officers and agents of the District are hereby authorized and directed to make changes to the Second Supplemental to achieve the purposes for which the Certificates are being executed and delivered.

SECTION 6. The form of the Reimbursement Agreement on file with the District and considered at this meeting are hereby approved. The officers and agents of the District are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver the Reimbursement Agreement in substantially the form on file with the District and considered at this meeting, with such changes therein as the officers and agents of the District may approve, in their discretion, as being in the best interests of the District. The District hereby approves the reimbursement of the Bank for certain payments in connection with the Certificates pursuant to the Reimbursement Agreement.

SECTION 7. The form of the Remarketing Agreement on file with the District and considered at this meeting are hereby approved. The officers and agents of the District are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver the Remarketing Agreement in

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substantially the form on file with the District and considered at this meeting, with such changes therein as the officers and agents of the District may approve, in their discretion, as being in the best interests of the District.

SECTION 8. The form of an official statement containing certain information regarding the District and relating to the Certificates (the "Official Statement") on file with the District and considered at this meeting is hereby approved with such changes therein as are reasonable and customary and as are approved by the Superintendent or his or her designee, as being in the best interests of the District. The distribution of the Official Statement in conjunction with the sale and delivery of the Certificates is hereby approved. The Superintendent or his or her designee of the District are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Official Statement.

SECTION 9. The form of Purchase Agreement on file with the District and considered at this meeting is hereby approved and the Certificates are hereby authorized to be sold to the Underwriter pursuant to the Purchase Agreement subject to the conditions set forth in this Section 10. The officers and agents of the District are hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver the Purchase Agreement in substantially the form on file with the District and considered at this meeting, with such changes therein as the officers and agents of the District may approve, in their discretion, as being in the best interests of the District, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof; provided that (i) the aggregate principal amount of the Certificates shall not exceed \$[14,000,000], and (ii) the maximum aggregate underwriter's discount (excluding original issue discount, if any) from the principal amount of the Certificates shall not exceed two and one-half percent (2.5%) of the aggregate principal amount of the Certificates, excluding any costs of issuance to be paid by Underwriter, if any. All other terms and conditions shall be consistent with and shall carry out the intention of this Board's approval, as set forth herein.

SECTION 10. The officers and agents of the District are hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents and to take such actions as they may deem necessary or convenient in order to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution and to permit the execution and delivery of the Certificates as such officers and agents deem as being in the best interests of the District, in the manner described in the documents hereby approved.

REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT

This REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made as of September ___, 2003 by and among BANK OF AMERICA, N.A., a national banking association (the "Bank"), the CALIFORNIA PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCING AUTHORITY (the "Authority") and the WESTERN PLACER UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, a unified school district organized under constitution and the laws of the State of California (the "District").

RECITALS

- A. The District has the present need to construct and improve a new elementary school to be known as the Foskett Elementary School and certain other school facilities located within the boundaries of the District (collectively, the "Project");
- B. For the purpose of financing of the Project, the District has determined to execute and deliver up to \$14,000,000.00 aggregate principal amount of its Adjustable Rate Certificates of Participation (School Facilities Project) Series 2003B (the "Certificates"), to be executed and delivered under and pursuant to the terms of a Master Trust Agreement, dated as of July 1, 2003 (the "Master Trust Agreement") between the Authority and U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee (the "Trustee"), as supplemented by a Second Supplemental Trust Agreement dated as of September ___, 2003 among the Authority, the District an the Trustee (the "Trust Agreement");
- C. In order to provide a source for payment when due of the principal and interest with respect to and the purchase price of the Certificates, the Bank will provide a direct pay letter of credit (the "Letter of Credit") pursuant to this Agreement initially in the amount of \$14,000,000;
- D. The Bank is willing to provide the Letter of Credit to the Trustee upon the terms and conditions herein set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the covenants contained herein, and in order to induce the Bank to issue its letter of credit, the District, the Authority and the Bank hereby agree as follows (capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined have the meaning set forth in Section 1 hereof):

ARTICLE ONE

DEFINITIONS

Section 1.1 Definitions. Capitalized terms not defined in this Agreement shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Trust Agreement. In addition to terms defined elsewhere in this Agreement, as used herein the following terms shall have the following meanings unless the context otherwise requires, and such meanings shall be equally applicable to both singular and plural forms of the terms herein defined:

"<u>Agreement</u>" shall mean this Reimbursement Agreement, as the same may from time to time be amended, supplemented or otherwise modified in accordance with its terms.

"Authority" shall mean the California Public School District Financing Authority, a joint powers authority, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of California.

et | Pee | H.M "<u>Authorized Representative</u>" shall mean such person at the time and from time to time authorized by resolution to act on behalf of the District by written certificate furnished to the Bank.

"Bank" shall mean Bank of America, N.A.

"Bank Certificates" shall mean the Certificates held by the Tender Agent for the benefit of the Bank as provided in Section 4.10 of the Trust Agreement.

"Business Day" shall mean a day other than a Saturday, Sunday or other day on which commercial banks are authorized to close, or are in fact closed, in the state where the Bank's lending office is located.

"Certificates" means the Western Placer Unified School District Adjustable Rate Certificates of Participation (School Facilities Project) Series 2003B.

"<u>Date of Issuance</u>" shall mean the date on which the Bank delivers the Letter of Credit pursuant to this Agreement.

"Default Rate" shall mean the Prime Rate plus 3% per annum.

"<u>District</u>" shall mean the Western Placer Unified School District, a unified school district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the Constitution and the laws of the State of California.

"Drawing" shall mean a drawing under the Letter of Credit resulting from the presentation to the Bank by the Trustee of a certificate in the form of Annex A, B, C or D to the Letter of Credit.

"<u>Drawing Date</u>" shall mean the date on which the Bank pays a Drawing on the Letter of Credit.

"Event of Default" shall mean any event specified in Section 6.1 of this Agreement, provided that any requirement for notice, lapse of time, or both, or any other condition has been satisfied.

"Expiration Date" shall mean the Stated Expiration Date specified in the Letter of Credit.

"<u>Letter of Credit</u>" shall mean the irrevocable direct pay letter of credit to be issued by the Bank pursuant hereto for the account of the District in favor of the Trustee to support payment of the Certificates, in substantially the form of Exhibit A to this Agreement with appropriate insertions, as it may be amended or supplemented from time to time.

" <u>Letter of Credit Co</u>	<u>ommitment</u> " shall mean U.S. \$[00,000,00)0], which is comprised of a

"<u>Lease Payments</u>" shall mean the Base Rental and Additional Rental payable under the Sublease Agreement.

"Obligations" shall mean the fees relating to the Letter of Credit, any and all obligations of the District to reimburse the Bank for a drawing under the Letter of Credit, and all other obligations of the District to the Bank arising under or in relation to this Agreement.



"Payment Office" shall mean with respect to the Bank, the office of the Bank located at the address set forth on the signature page of this Agreement or such other office as the Bank may from time to time designate.

"Person" means a natural person, a firm, a corporation, a partnership, an association, a trust or any other entity or organization, including a government or political subdivision or any agency or instrumentality thereof.

"Prime Rate" shall mean the rate of interest publicly announced from time to time by the Bank as its Prime Rate. The Prime Rate is set by the Bank based on various factors, including the Bank's costs and desired return, general economic conditions and other factors, and is used as a reference point for pricing some loans. The Bank may price loans to its customers at, above, or below the Prime Rate. Any change in the Prime Rate shall take effect at the opening of business on the day specified in the public announcement of a change in the Bank's Prime Rate.

"Project" shall have the meaning assigned to that term in Recital A.

"Related Documents" shall have the meaning set forth in Section 3.1(d) hereof.

"Stated Amount" shall mean the principal amount available to be drawn under each Letter of Credit.

"Trust Agreement" shall mean the Master Trust Agreement dated as of July 1, 2003 between the Authority and the Trustee, as supplemented by the Second Supplemental Trust Agreement dated as of September ___, 2003 among the Authority, the District and the Trustee, which provides for the execution and delivery of the Certificates.

ARTICLE TWO

LETTER OF CREDIT

Section 2.1. Issuance of Letter of Credit.

- (a) <u>Issuance of Letter of Credit</u>. The Bank hereby agrees, on the terms and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to issue the Letter of Credit to the Trustee, in accordance with the terms of this Section 2.1. The Letter of Credit shall be issued by the Bank upon satisfaction by the District and the Authority of all conditions precedent set forth in Section 3.1 hereof, and for a stated term from the date of the Letter of Credit to the Expiration Date.
- (b) <u>Drawing on the Letter of Credit</u>. Drawings to be made under the Letter of Credit shall be made by presentation by hand delivery or by telecopy, with receipt confirmed, with an original to follow by mail, in the form of a sight draft, accompanied by the appropriate annex submitted by the Trustee and no further presentation of documentation, including the original Letter of Credit, need be made; it being understood that the telecopy, with receipt confirmed, shall in all events be considered to be the sole operative instrument of drawing. The Bank may rely upon any such telecopy drawing that the Bank, in good faith, believes to have been dispatched by the Trustee.
- (c) <u>Reduction and Reinstatement</u>. The Stated Amount of the Letter of Credit shall be reduced by the amount of each Drawing, and shall be reinstated following certain Drawings, all as provided in the Letter of Credit.



Section 2.2. Reimbursement of Drawings.

- (a) The District hereby agrees to reimburse the Bank for any Drawing under the Letter of Credit as follows: (i) on the same day established under the Trust Agreement for payment of amounts due with respect to the Certificates, a sum equal to the amount drawn and paid on the Letter of Credit on such payment date to pay regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest accrued with respect to the Certificates; (ii) upon demand, upon the occurrence of an Event of Default, interest on all Obligations, including all outstanding Drawings, at the Default Rate; and (iii) no later than thirty (30) days following the date of a Drawing to pay the purchase price of tendered Certificates, the amount drawn under the Letter of Credit, together with interest thereon at the Prime Rate.
- (b) The District hereby agrees to pay interest on the unpaid principal amount of each Drawing due pursuant to Section 2.2(a)(iii) at a rate per annum equal to the Prime Rate. The principal amount of any Drawing not paid when due shall bear interest at the Default Rate.
- (c) If the District shall fail to pay when due (whether at maturity, on demand, by reason of acceleration or otherwise) any amount due and unpaid hereunder, each such unpaid amount shall (to the extent permitted by applicable law) bear interest for each day from and including the date it was so due until paid in full at a rate per annum equal to the Default Rate, payable on demand.

Section 2.3. Letter of Credit Fees and Other Payments

- (a) <u>Commitment Fee.</u> Borrower agrees to pay a commitment fee of up to Fourteen and No/100 Dollars (\$_____.00) [.10% of the Initial Stated Amount] on the Date of Issuance, which fee shall be deemed fully earned by the Bank upon its commitment to issue the Letter of Credit, and shall be nonrefundable.
- (b) <u>Letter of Credit Fee.</u> The District agrees to pay an annual Letter of Credit fee equal to the number of percentage points indicated below for the then-current issuer general obligation ratings by Standard & Poor's Rating Service and Moody's Investor Service on the District's general obligations:

Rating	Percentage Points
A2/A or better	.65%
A3/A-	.75%
BBB+/Baa1	1.00%

If either S&P or Moody's shall rate the issuer general obligation credit ratings of the District lower than the other rating agency, the number of percentage points used to calculate the fee will be determined by reference to the lower rating.

The initial Letter of Credit fee shall be due and payable on the Date of Issuance and shall include the fees for the period commencing on the Date of Issuance through the first anniversary of the Date of Issuance. Thereafter, the Letter of Credit fee shall be paid annually in advance on the anniversary date of the Date of Issuance. The Letter of Credit fee is fully earned each time it is paid and shall be payable whether or not the Letter of Credit remains outstanding throughout the entire period for which it is paid.



- (c) Other Fees. In addition, the District shall pay to Bank upon the amendment or transfer of the Letter of Credit and upon the negotiation of each draft drawn under the Letter of Credit, fees and charges determined by Bank in accordance with Bank's standard fees and charges in effect at the time the Letter of Credit is amended or transferred or any draft is paid.
- (d) <u>Calculation of Fees and Interest</u>. All fees and interest payable under this Agreement shall be calculated on the basis of a 365-day year and actual days elapsed.
- (e) <u>Costs and Expenses</u>. The District shall pay any and all fees, charges and expenses, payable or incurred by the Bank in connection with the execution, delivery, performance and enforcement of this Agreement and the Letter of Credit, including without limitation, the fees and expenses of counsel to the Bank, together with interest on such amounts from the date such payment is due until paid at a rate per annum equal to the Default Rate, and agrees to save the Bank harmless from and against any and all liabilities with respect to or resulting from any delay in paying or omission to pay such fees and expenses.
- (f) Additional Costs. The District will pay the Bank, on demand, for the Bank's costs or losses arising from any statute or regulation, or any request or requirement of a regulatory agency which is applicable to all national banks or a class of all national banks. The costs and losses will be allocated to the loan in a manner determined by the Bank, using any reasonable method. The costs include the following:
 - (i) any reserve or deposit requirements; and
 - (ii) any capital requirements relating to the Bank's assets and commitments for credit.
- (g) <u>Payment Office</u>. All payments to be made by the District to the Bank hereunder or in connection herewith, shall be made at the address of the Bank set forth on the signature page hereof not later than 1:00 p.m., Los Angeles time, on the date due and shall be made in lawful money of the United States of America and in immediately available funds. Any amount not received by the Bank by such time shall be deemed to have been received on the next succeeding Business Day. All such payments not received on the date due shall bear interest until payment in full at the Default Rate.
- (h) <u>Obligation Absolute</u>. The obligations of the District under this Agreement shall be unconditional and irrevocable, and shall be paid or performed strictly in accordance with the terms of this Agreement under all circumstances whatsoever, including, without limitation, the following circumstances:
 - (i) the existence of any claim, set-off, defense or other rights which the District may have at any time against the Trustee, any beneficiary or any transferee of the Letter of Credit (or any persons for whom the Trustee, any such beneficiary or any such transferee may be acting) or the Bank, whether in connection with the transactions contemplated by this Agreement or any related or unrelated transactions;
 - (ii) any breach of contract or other dispute between the District, the Authority, the Trustee, any beneficiary or any transferee of the Letter of Credit (or any person for whom the Trustee, any such beneficiary or any such transferee may be acting), the Bank or any other person:
 - (iii) any delay, extension of time, renewal, compromise or other indulgence or modification granted or agreed to by the Bank, with or without notice to

or approval by the District, in respect of any of the District's obligations to the Bank under this Agreement;

- (iv) any certificate, statement or any other document presented under the Letter of Credit proving to be forged, fraudulent, invalid or insufficient in any respect or any statement therein being untrue or inaccurate in any respect, <u>provided</u> that payment by the Bank under the Letter of Credit against presentation of any such certificate, statement or document shall not have constituted gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Bank;
- (v) any non-application or misapplication by the Trustee of the proceeds of any Drawing under the Letter of Credit;
- (vi) payment by the Bank under the Letter of Credit against presentation of a certificate which does not comply with the terms of the Letter of Credit, <u>provided</u> that such payment by the Bank shall not have constituted gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Bank; and
- (vii) any other circumstance or happening whatsoever, whether or not similar to any of the foregoing.
- (i) <u>Non-Business Days</u>. If any sum becomes payable pursuant to this Agreement on a day which is not a Business Day, the date for payment thereof shall be extended, without penalty, to the next succeeding Business Day, and such extended time shall be included in the computation of interest and fees.
- Taxes. All payments made by the District hereunder shall be made free and clear of and without deduction for any present or future income, stamp or other taxes, levies, imposts, deductions, charges, fees, withholdings, restrictions or conditions of any nature now or hereafter imposed, levied, collected, withheld or assessed by any jurisdiction or by any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof or therein (whether pursuant to United States Federal, state or local law or foreign law) and all interest, penalties or similar liabilities, excluding taxes on the overall net income of the Bank (such non-excluded taxes are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Taxes"). If the District shall be required by law to deduct or to withhold any Taxes from or in respect of any amount payable hereunder, (i) the amount so payable shall be increased to the extent necessary so that after making all required deductions and withholdings (including Taxes on amounts payable to the Bank pursuant to this sentence) and decreased to give effect to any refunds or credits received by the Bank so that the Bank receives an amount equal to the sum it would have received had no such deductions or withholdings been made (ii) the District shall make such deductions or withholdings and (iii) the District shall pay the full amount deducted or withheld to the relevant taxation authority in accordance with applicable law. Whenever any Taxes are payable by the District, as promptly as possible thereafter the District shall send the Bank an official receipt or other documentation satisfactory to the Bank evidencing payment to such taxation authority.
- (k) <u>Maximum Rate</u>. To the extent permitted by law, in the event that a rate of interest required to be paid by the District under this Agreement shall exceed a maximum rate established by law, any subsequent reduction in the rate of interest required to be paid by the District hereunder will not reduce the rate of interest below the maximum rate established by law until the total amount of interest accrued equals the amount of interest which would have accrued if the rate of interest required hereunder (without giving effect to this paragraph) had at all times been in effect. The Bank understands and acknowledges that its right to demand increases in Lease Payments is limited to the extent that Lease Payments may not exceed the fair rental value for the Property.

Section 2.4. Liability of Bank. Neither the Bank nor any of its officers or directors shall

be liable or responsible for (a) the use which may be made of the Letter of Credit or for any acts or omissions of the Trustee and any transfer in connection therewith; (b) the validity, sufficiency or genuineness of documents, or of any endorsement(s) thereon, even if such documents should in fact prove to be in any or all respects invalid, insufficient, fraudulent or forged; (c) payment by the Bank against presentation of documents which do not comply with the terms of the Letter of Credit, including failure of any documents to bear any reference or adequate reference to the Letter of Credit; or (d) any other circumstances whatsoever in making or failing to make payment under the Letter of Credit, except only that the District shall have a claim against the Bank, and the Bank shall be liable to the District, to the extent of any damages suffered by the District by (i) the Bank's willful misconduct or gross negligence in determining whether documents presented under the Letter of Credit comply with the terms of the Letter of Credit or (ii) the Bank's willful failure or gross negligence in failing to pay under the Letter of Credit after the presentation to it by the Trustee of a sight draft and certificate strictly complying with the terms and conditions of the Letter of Credit. In furtherance and not in limitation of the foregoing, the Bank may accept documents that appear on their face to be in order, without responsibility for further investigation, regardless of any notice or information to the contrary; provided, that if the Bank shall receive written notification from the Trustee and the District that sufficiently identified (in the opinion of the Bank) documents to be presented to the Bank are not to be honored, the Bank agrees that it will not honor such documents.

The Bank shall not be liable or responsible in any respect for (i) any error, omission, interruption or delay in transmission, dispatch or delivery of any message or advice, however transmitted, in connection with the Letter of Credit or (ii) any action, inaction or omission which may be taken by it in good faith in connection with the Letter of Credit; provided that the District shall not be liable or responsible in any respect if such liability or responsibility results from the willful misconduct or gross negligence of the Bank. The District further agrees that any action taken or omitted by the Bank under or in connection with the Letter of Credit or the related draft or documents, if done in good faith without gross negligence, shall be effective against the District as to the rights, duties and obligations of the Bank and shall not place the Bank under any liability to the District.

Section 2.5. <u>Nature of Obligations of the District</u>. The obligations of the District under this Agreement shall constitute a general fund obligation of the District. The obligations of the District under this Agreement to reimburse the Bank for Drawings shall be paid and performed strictly in accordance with the terms of this Agreement under all circumstances whatsoever, including, without limitation, the following circumstances:

- (a) any lack of validity or enforceability of this Agreement, the Letter of Credit or any of the Related Documents;
- (b) any amendment or waiver of, or any consent to or departure from this Agreement or any Related Documents;
- (c) the existence of any claim, set-off, defense or other rights which the District may have at any time against the Trustee, any beneficiary or any transferee of the Letter of Credit (or any person for whom the Trustee, any such beneficiary or any such transferee may be acting), the Bank or any other person, whether in connection with this Agreement, the Letter of Credit, the Related Documents or any unrelated transaction;
- (d) any statement in any certificate or any other document presented under the Letter of Credit proving to be forged, fraudulent, invalid or insufficient in any respect or any statement therein being untrue or inaccurate in any respect whatsoever;
- (e) payment by the Bank under the Letter of Credit against presentation of a draft or certificate which does not comply with the terms of the Letter of Credit;

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unless any of the foregoing results from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Bank.

ARTICLE THREE

CONDITIONS PRECEDENT

Section 3.1. Conditions Precedent to Issuance of Letter of Credit. The obligation of the Bank to issue the Letter of Credit shall be subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions precedent on or before the Date of Issuance thereof, in a manner satisfactory to the Bank and its counsel:

- (a) The Bank shall have received an opinion of O'Melveny & Myers, LLP, as special counsel, in form and substance satisfactory to the Bank and its counsel, dated the Date of Issuance.
- (b) The Bank shall have received an opinion of counsel to the District, in form and substance satisfactory to the Bank and its counsel;
- (c) The Bank shall have received an opinion of counsel to the Authority, in form and substance satisfactory to the Bank and its counsel;
- (d) The Bank shall have received on the Date of Issuance certified copies or executed originals, as the Bank may request, of this Agreement, the Trust Agreement, the Lease Agreement, the Sublease Agreement, the Assignment Agreement, the Remarketing Agreement, and the Certificates (collectively, the "Related Documents") and any other documents which the Bank may reasonably request evidencing that all necessary action (including, without limitation, adoption of resolutions) required to be taken by the District and the Authority in connection with the authorization, execution, issuance, delivery and performance of such documents and any other document required to be delivered by the District or the Authority pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby, has been taken.
- (e) The Bank shall have received payment of the Commitment Fee required by Section 2.3(a), the Letter of Credit fee required by Section 2.3(b) and reimbursement of all out-of-pockets costs and expenses in connection with the issuance of the Letter of Credit and the execution and delivery of this Agreement and the Related Documents, including without limitation, attorneys' fees and expenses.
- (f) The Bank shall have received a certificate signed by an Authorized Representative of the District dated the Date of Issuance stating that on such date:
 - (i) the representations and warranties set forth in this Agreement and in any other certificate, letter, writing or instrument delivered by the District to the Bank pursuant hereto or in connection herewith, shall be true and correct as of the Date of Issuance;
 - (ii) no material adverse change shall have occurred in the condition (financial or otherwise) of the District since the date of the District's most recent financial statements delivered to the Bank;
 - (iii) on the Date of Issuance, no Event of Default or no event, act or omission which with notice, lapse of time or both, would constitute such an Event of Default, shall have occurred and be continuing; and



- (iv) there is no lawsuit, tax claim or other dispute pending or threatened against the District which, if lost, would impair the District's financial condition or ability to repay the unreimbursed Drawings, except as have been disclosed in writing to the Bank.
- (g) The Bank shall have received copies of resolutions of the Board of Education of the District, certified by the District Clerk, authorizing, among other things, the execution, delivery and performance by the District of this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party and authorizing the District to obtain issuance of the Letter of Credit pursuant to this Agreement.
- (h) The Bank shall have received a certificate of an Authorized Representative of the District dated the Date of Issuance certifying as to the authority, incumbency and specimen signatures of the Authorized Representative of the District authorized to sign this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party and any other documents to be delivered by it hereunder and who will be authorized to represent the District in connection with this Agreement, upon which the Bank may rely until it receives a new such certificate.
- (i) The Bank shall have received copies of resolutions of the Authority, certified by an authorized representative of the Authority, authorizing, among other things, the execution, delivery and performance by the Authority of this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party and authorizing the execution and delivery of the Certificates.
- (j) The Bank shall have received a certificate of an authorized representative of the Authority dated the Date of Issuance certifying as to the authority, incumbency and specimen signatures of the authorized representative of the Authority authorized to sign this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party and any other documents to be delivered by it hereunder and who will be authorized to represent the Authority in connection with this Agreement, upon which the Bank may rely until it receives a new such certificate.
- (k) Except for state "blue sky" laws, the Bank shall have received true and correct copies of any and all governmental approvals necessary for the District and the Authority to enter into this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party and such approvals necessary at the Closing Date for the transactions contemplated thereby and hereby, or if no governmental approvals are required, a certificate of an Authorized Representative of the District to the effect that no such approvals are necessary.
- (I) The Bank shall have received copies of the audited financial statements of the District for the three most recent years for which such statements are available, unaudited financial statements of the District for any fiscal year for which audited financial statements are unavailable, a copy of the District's 2002-2003 adopted budget and a copy of the proposed 2003-2004 budget that has been submitted by the District to the County Office of Education.
- (m) A certificate of the Trustee, as to such matters as the Bank shall reasonably request.
- (n) An opinion of counsel to the Trustee, in form and substance satisfactory to the Bank and its counsel.
- (o) Evidence of business interruption insurance, general liability and property damage insurance required to be carried by the District pursuant to the Sublease Agreement satisfactory to the Bank and naming the Bank as an additional insured.
- (p) Evidence that the unenhanced credit rating on the Certificates is BBB+ by S&P or Baa1 by Moody's.

- (q) A copy of the fully executed fixed price contract for construction of the Twelve Bridges Elementary School with a fixed price not to exceed \$18,700,000.
- (r) Evidence that the District has been awarded a matched-funding grant in an amount not less than \$11,200,000 from the Office of Public School Construction and State Allocation Board of the State of California.
- (s) Copies of complete appraisals on the Property to be leased under the Sublease Agreement.
- (t) All other legal matters pertaining to the execution and delivery of this Agreement, the issuance of the Letter of Credit and the other Related Documents shall be reasonably satisfactory to the Bank and their counsel.

ARTICLE FOUR

REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- Section 4.1. Representations and Warranties. In order to induce the Bank to enter into this Agreement and to issue the Letter of Credit provided for in this Agreement, the District represents and as of the Date of Issuance, warrants and covenants with respect to itself, this Agreement and certain matters:
- (a) The District is a unified school district organized and existing by virtue of and under the Constitution and the laws of the State of California, has the requisite power to carry on its present and proposed activities, and has and had full power, right and authority to enter into this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party and to perform each and all of the matters and things herein and therein.
- (b) This Agreement, and any instrument or agreement required hereunder, are within the District's powers, have been duly authorized, and do not conflict with any of its organizational papers.
- (c) This Agreement is a legal, valid and binding agreement of the District, enforceable against the District in accordance with its terms, and any instrument or agreement required hereunder, when executed and delivered, will be similarly legal, valid, binding and enforceable.
- (d) The execution and delivery of, and performance by the District of its obligations under, this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party, and any and all instruments or documents required to be executed in connection herewith or therewith were and are within the powers of the District and will not violate any provision of any applicable law, regulation, decree or governmental authorization, and will not in any material respect violate or cause a default under any provision of any contract, agreement, mortgage, indenture or other undertaking to which it is a party or which is binding upon it or any of its property or assets, and will not result in the imposition or creation of any lien, charge, or encumbrance upon any of its properties or assets pursuant to the provisions of any such contract, agreement, mortgage, indenture or undertaking.
- (e) Except for state "blue sky" laws, all authorizations, licenses, consents, approvals and undertakings which are required to be obtained by the District under any applicable law in connection with the execution, delivery and performance by the District of its obligations under, or in connection with, this Agreement and the Related Documents to which it is a party, have been received on or prior to the Date of Issuance; and all such authorizations, licenses, consents,

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approvals and undertakings are in full force and effect.

- (f) This Agreement does not conflict with any law, agreement, or other obligation by which the District is bound.
- (g) All financial and other information that has been or will be supplied to the Bank is sufficiently complete to give the Bank accurate knowledge of the District's financial condition, including all material contingent liabilities. Since the date of the most recent financial statement provided to the Bank, except as disclosed in the Official Statement, there has been no material adverse change in the business condition (financial or otherwise), operations, properties or prospects of the District.
- (h) There is no lawsuit, tax claim or other dispute pending or threatened against the District which, if lost, would impair the District's financial condition or ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement, except as have been disclosed in writing to the Bank.
- (i) The Property is owned by the District free of any title defects or any liens or interests of others, except those which have been approved by the Bank in writing.
- (j) The District is not in default on any obligation for borrowed money, any purchase money obligation or any other material lease, commitment, contract, instrument or obligation.
- (k) The District is not immune from jurisdiction in any federal court or court within the State of California or from legal process under the laws or in the courts of the United States of America or the State of California with respect to this Agreement or any of the Related Documents.
- (I) The representations and warranties of the District in the Related Documents to which it is a party are true and correct, and the District makes such representations and warranties for the benefit of the Bank as if the same were set forth at length in this Agreement and the District has furnished the Bank a true and correct copy of all of the Related Documents as in effect on the date hereof.
- (m) The statements and information contained in the Official Statement issued in connection with the offering and sale of the Certificates (other than the statements and information contained under the captions "THE LETTER OF CREDIT AND THE REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT" and "THE BANK" thereto) and all statements and information made in writing by the District to the Bank herein or in connection herewith are and at the Date of Issuance will be true, correct and complete in all material respects as such statements and information pertains to the District and as to such statements, does not and at the Date of Issuance will not omit any statement or information necessary to make the statements and information therein, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading in any material respect.
- (n) The statements and information contained in any disclosure documents issued in connection with the offer and sale of any bonds, notes or other obligations issued by the District are true, correct and complete in all material respects as such statements and information pertains to the District.

ARTICLE FIVE

COVENANTS

Section 5.1. <u>Affirmative Covenants</u>. The District covenants and agrees with the Bank as follows:

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- (a) The District shall reimburse the Bank for any unreimbursed Drawings under the Letter of Credit as required by Section 2.2(a).
- (b) The District shall provide the following financial information and statements in form and content acceptable to the Bank, and such additional information as requested by the Bank from time to time:
 - (i) Within 210 days of the District's fiscal year end, the District's annual financial statements, certified and dated by an authorized financial officer of the District. These financial statements must be audited (with an unqualified opinion) by a Certified Public Accountant acceptable to the Bank.
 - (ii) The District shall, promptly upon its approval and within 30 days of the final adoption of the annual budget of the District, deliver to the Bank a copy of such budget and promptly after the adoption thereof, copies of any and all amendments and supplements to the budget.
 - (iii) Promptly, upon sending or receipt, copies of any management letters and correspondence relating to management letters, sent or received by the District to or from the District's Certified Public Accountant.
 - (iv) Within the period provided in (i) above, a compliance certificate of the District signed by an authorized financial officer of the District setting forth whether there existed as of the date of such financial statements and whether there exists as of the date of the certificate, any default under this Agreement and, if any such default exists, specifying the nature thereof and the action the District is taking and proposes to take with respect thereto.
 - (v) Within 270 days after the end of each of District's fiscal years, written confirmation that the District's issuer general obligation credit rating is not less than BBB+ by S&P or Baa1 by Moody's.
 - (vi) The District shall provide such additional information as shall be reasonably requested by the Bank within 20 days after the Bank's request for such information.
- (c) The District shall promptly notify the Bank in writing of any lawsuit with a demand over One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) against the District.
- (d) The District shall maintain adequate books and records and shall maintain its financial records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applicable to governmental entities, applied consistently, throughout the term of this Agreement.
- (e) The District shall allow the Bank and its agents to inspect the District's properties and examine, audit, and make copies of books and records at any reasonable time. If any of the District's properties, books or records are in the possession of a third party, the District authorizes that third party to permit the Bank or its agents to have access to perform inspections or audits and to respond to the Bank's requests for information concerning such properties, books and records.
- (f) The District shall maintain insurance satisfactory to the Bank as to amount, nature and carrier covering property damage (including loss of use and occupancy) to any of the District's properties, public liability insurance including coverage for contractual liability, product

liability and workers' compensation, and any other insurance which is usual for the District, and in any case shall maintain the insurance required by Section 4.3 of the Sublease Agreement. Each such policy shall name the Bank as an additional insured pursuant to a lender's loss payable endorsement.

- (g) The District shall not have outstanding or incur any direct or contingent liabilities or lease obligations (other than the Related Documents and the obligations of the District to the Bank under this Agreement) with respect to the Property, or permit any lien or encumbrance on the Property without the Bank's written consent.
- (h) The District shall not permit any material adverse change to its operations or properties throughout the term of this Agreement.
- (i) The District shall execute and deliver to the Bank all such documents, consents and instruments and do all such other acts and things as may be reasonably necessary or required by the Bank to enable the Bank to exercise and enforce their rights under the Related Documents and the Related Documents and to realize thereon, and record and file and re-record and re-file all such documents and instruments, at such time or times, in such manner and at such place or places, all as may be necessary or required by the Bank to validate, preserve and protect the position of the Bank under the Related Documents.
- (j) The District shall comply, in all material respects, with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and requirements of governmental authorities except where the necessity of compliance therewith is contested in good faith by appropriate proceedings.
- (k) The District has complied with and shall comply with all health, safety, or environmental law or regulation regarding Hazardous Substances, and the District is not the subject of any claim, proceeding, notice, or other communication regarding Hazardous Substances. The District shall give the Bank prompt written notice of any such claim, proceeding, notice or other communication regarding Hazardous Substances. "Hazardous Substances" means any substance, material or waste that is or becomes designated or regulated as "toxic," "hazardous," "pollutant," or "contaminant" or a similar designation or regulation under any federal, state or local law (whether under common law, statute, regulation or otherwise) or judicial or administrative interpretation of such, including without limitation petroleum or natural gas.
- (I) The District shall perform all of its obligations under the Sublease Agreement and the other Related Documents, including, without limitation, its obligation to make annual appropriations for Lease Payments as required by Section 3.3 of the Sublease Agreement.
- (m) The District shall not amend or supplement any of the Related Documents without the prior written consent of the Bank.
- (n) The District shall maintain the Debt Service Reserve Fund at the Reserve Requirement as provided in the Trust Agreement.
- (o) On the first Business Day of each February and August, commencing on February 1, 2005, the District shall prepay Lease Payments and the Trustee shall use such funds to make the sinking fund prepayments of Certificates as provided in Section 3.1(e) of the First Supplemental Indenture.
- (p) Financial Covenants. The District shall maintain a ratio of (i) its revenues from the Mello-Roos Fund and Capital Facilities Fund within the Capital Projects Funds shown in its audited financial statements to (ii) debt service on all of the District's outstanding long-term financial obligations (including, without limitation, its obligation to make Lease Payments under the Sublease

Agreement and debt service for other certificates of participation and capital leases) of not less than 1.1:1.0.

(q) Within 120 days after the completion of Twelve Bridges Elementary School, the District shall substitute the Twelve Bridges Elementary School for one of the schools comprising the Property in accordance with the terms of the Sublease Agreement.

ARTICLE SIX

DEFAULTS

Section 6.1. Events of Defaults and Remedies. If any of the following events shall occur and be continuing, each such event shall be an "Event of Default":

- (a) The District shall fail to pay when due any amount payable by the District to the Bank under this Agreement.
- (b) The Certificates or any other Related Document ceases to be valid and binding against the District or the District repudiates its obligations under this Agreement or any of the Related Documents.
- (c) The District files a bankruptcy petition or the District makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors.
- (d) Any judgments or arbitration awards are entered against the District, or the District enters into any settlement agreements with respect to any litigation or arbitration, in an aggregate amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) or more in excess of any insurance coverage.
- (e) Any default occurs under any agreement in connection with any credit the District has obtained from any Person other than the Bank or which the District has guaranteed in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) or more in the aggregate if the default consists of failing to make a payment when due or gives the other lender the right to accelerate the obligation.
- (f) Any default occurs under the Sublease Agreement or any other Related Document.
- (g) The District fails to meet the conditions of, or fails to perform any obligation under, any term of this Agreement not specifically referred to in this Article.
- (h) The District has given the Bank false or misleading information or representations.
- (i) The issuer general obligation credit ratings of the District shall fall below BBB+ by Standard & Poor's Rating Service or Baa1 by Moody's Investors Service. If either S&P or Moody's shall rate the issuer general obligation credit ratings of the District lower than the other rating agency, the default will be determined by reference to the lower rating.

If an Event of Default shall have occurred and be continuing, the Bank may (i) give notice to the Trustee under the Trust Agreement of the Bank's election to cause a mandatory tender of the Certificates because of the occurrence and continuance of an Event of Default under the Reimbursement Agreement, (ii) declare all unpaid amounts drawn under the Letter of Credit and the corresponding Bank Certificates, together with all interest accrued and unpaid thereon and all other amounts payable to the Bank hereunder to be immediately due and payable, without presentment,

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demand, protest or any notice of any kind or (iii) exercise any and all rights and remedies available to the Bank under this Agreement or the Trust Agreement, at law or in equity. In the event of the occurrence of an Event of Default described in Section 6.1(c), all amounts drawn under the Letter of Credit and the corresponding Bank Certificates, together with all interest accrued thereon and all other amounts owed to the Bank hereunder shall be immediately due and payable, without notice to the District and without presentment, demand, protest or further notice of any kind.

ARTICLE SEVEN

MISCELLANEOUS

Section 7.1. Modification of this Agreement. No amendment, modification or waiver of any provision of this Agreement or any other Related Document, and no consent to any departure by the District therefrom, shall be effective unless the same shall be in writing and signed by the Bank and no amendment, modification or waiver of any provision of the Letter of Credit shall in any event be effective unless the same shall be in writing and signed by the Bank. Any such waiver or consent shall be effective only in the specific instance and for the purpose for which given. No notice to or demand on the District in any case shall entitle the District to any other or further notice or demand in the same, similar or other circumstances.

Section 7.2. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement is binding on the District's and the Bank's successors and assignees. The District agrees that it may not assign this Agreement without the Bank's prior consent. The Bank may sell participations in or assign this facility, and may exchange financial information about the District with actual or potential participants or assignees; provided that such actual or potential participants or assignees shall agree to treat all financial information exchanged as confidential; and further provided that under no circumstances with such assignment or grant of participations relieve the Bank of its obligations under the Letter of Credit. If a participation is sold or the loan is assigned, the purchaser will have the right of set-off against the District.

Section 7.3 Administration Costs. The District shall pay the Bank for all costs and expenses incurred by the Bank in connection with the preparation, due diligence, administration and enforcement of this Agreement and the transactions contemplated by this Agreement, including without limitation, the legal fees and expenses of counsel to the Bank, whether the Letter of Credit is issued or not.

Section 7.4 Attorneys' Fees. The District shall reimburse the Bank for any reasonable costs and attorneys' fees incurred by the Bank in connection with the enforcement or preservation of any rights or remedies under this Agreement and any other documents executed in connection with this Agreement, and in connection with any amendment, waiver, "workout" or restructuring under this Agreement. In the event of a lawsuit or arbitration proceeding, the prevailing party is entitled to recover costs and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in connection with the lawsuit or arbitration proceeding, as determined by the court or arbitrator. In the event that any case is commenced by or against the District under the Bankruptcy Code (Title 11, United States Code) or any similar or successor statute, the Bank is entitled to recover costs and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the Bank related to the preservation, protection, or enforcement of any rights of the Bank in such a case. As used in this paragraph, "attorneys' fees" includes the allocated costs of the Bank's in-house counsel.

Section 7.5 One Agreement. This Agreement and any related security or other agreements required by this Agreement, collectively:

represent the sum of the understandings and agreements between the Bank (a) 1,4.20 and the District concerning this credit;

- (b) replace any prior oral or written agreements between the Bank and the District concerning this credit; and
- (c) are intended by the Bank and the District as the final, complete and exclusive statement of the terms agreed to by them.

In the event of any conflict between this Agreement and any other agreements required by this Agreement, this Agreement will prevail.

Section 7.6. Indemnification. The District will indemnify and hold the Bank harmless from any loss, liability, damages, judgments, and costs of any kind relating to or arising directly or indirectly out of (a) this Agreement or any of the Related Documents, (b) any credit extended or committed by the Bank to the District hereunder, (c) any claim, whether well-founded or otherwise, that there has been a failure to comply with any law regulating the District's operations, the Certificates or any of the Related Documents, (d) the use storage, presence, disposal or release of any Hazardous Substances on or about the Property and (e) any litigation or proceeding related to or arising out of this Agreement, any such document, any such credit, or any such claim. This indemnity includes but is not limited to attorneys' fees (including the allocated cost of in-house counsel). This indemnity extends to the Bank, its parent, subsidiaries and all of their directors, officers, employees, agents, successors, attorneys, and assigns. This indemnity will survive repayment of the District's obligations to the Bank. All sums due to the Bank hereunder shall be obligations of the District, due and payable immediately without demand.

Section 7.7. <u>Notices</u>. Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement or in another agreement among the Authority, the Bank and the District, all notices required under this Agreement shall be personally delivered or sent by first class mail, postage prepaid, or by overnight courier, to the addresses on the signature page of this Agreement, or sent by facsimile to the fax numbers listed on the signature page, or to such other addresses as the Bank, the District and the Authority may specify from time to time in writing. Notices and other communications sent by (a) first class mail shall be deemed delivered on the earlier of actual receipt or on the fourth business day after deposit in the U.S. mail, postage prepaid, (b) overnight courier shall be deemed delivered on the next business day, and (c) telecopy shall be deemed delivered when transmitted.

Section 7.8. <u>Headings</u>. Article and paragraph headings are for reference only and shall not affect the interpretation or meaning of any provisions of this Agreement.

Section 7.9. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in as many counterparts as necessary or convenient, and by the different parties on separate counterparts each of which, when so executed, shall be deemed an original but all such counterparts shall constitute but one and the same agreement.

Section 7.10. <u>No Waiver; Remedies</u>. No failure on the part of the Bank to exercise, and no delay in exercising, any right hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof; nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right hereunder preclude any other further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right. The remedies herein provided are cumulative and not exclusive of any remedies provided by law.

Section 7.11. <u>Severability</u>. Any provision of this Agreement which is prohibited, unenforceable or not authorized in any jurisdiction shall, as to such jurisdiction, by ineffective to the extent of such prohibition, unenforceability or non-authorization without invalidating the remaining provisions hereof or affecting the validity, enforceability or legality of such provisions in any other jurisdiction.

Section 7.12. <u>Set-Off.</u> Upon the occurrence and during the continuance of any Event of Default the Bank is hereby authorized at any time and from time to time, without notice to the District (any such notice being expressly waived by the District) and to the fullest extent permitted by law, to set off and apply any and all deposits (general or special, time or demand, provisions or final) at any time held and other indebtedness at any time owing by the Bank, except in connection with the Letter of Credit as herein provided, to or for the credit or the account of the District against any and all of the obligations of the District now or hereafter existing under this Agreement, irrespective of whether or not the Bank shall have made any demand hereunder and although such obligations may not have matured.

Section 7.13. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the internal laws of the State of California.

In the event of termination of this Agreement, the Assistant Superintendent shall be entitled to full compensation for unused vacation at the salary rate effective during the school year in which the vacation credit was earned. In no case will more than thirty-five (35) days of unused vacation be paid at the expiration or termination of this contract.

11. Sick Leave:

The Assistant Superintendent shall be entitled to twelve (12) working days of sick leave each

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current contract year cumulative indefinitely.

12. Evaluation:

The Superintendent shall annually evaluate the performance of the Assistant Superintendent. This evaluation shall be based on the position description and the mutually agreed upon and specified goals and objectives in accordance with the procedures authorized in district policies.

13. Termination:

This Agreement shall terminate upon the happening of any of the following events:

- (a) Whenever the Assistant Superintendent and District shall mutually agree to termination in writing;
- (b) Upon the death of Assistant Superintendent or permanent incapacity to perform the duties of this office; or
- (c) Upon the grounds set forth in the California Education Code permitting or requiring termination of a certificated employee.

14. Early Termination:

Regardless of the term of this Agreement and pursuant to the requirements of Government Code Sections 53260 and 54261, it is hereby agreed that the Board, unilaterally and without cause, may terminate this Agreement and the Assistant Superintendent's status as an employee of the District. In consideration of the Board's right to terminate the Agreement without cause, the District shall pay to the Assistant Superintendent the then current salary for the remainder of the term of this Agreement, or for eighteen (18) months (see Government Code 53260(a) and 53261) following the effective date of termination, whichever is less. If the Board chooses to terminate the Assistant Superintendent as outlined in this paragraph, health and welfare benefits described in paragraph 4 shall remain in effect for the term of the agreement, not to exceed eighteen (18) months.

15. Entire Agreement:

This Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto with respect to the employment of Assistant Superintendent by the District and contains all of the covenants and Agreements between the parties with respect to that employment in any manner whatsoever.

Each party to this Agreement acknowledges that no representation, inducements, promises, or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party, or anyone acting on behalf of any party, which are not embodied herein, and that no other agreement, statement or promise not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding on either party.

16. Modifications:

Any modification of this Agreement will be effective only if it is in writing and signed by

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both parties.

17. Severability:

The provisions of this Agreement are divisible; if any such provision shall be deemed invalid or unenforceable, such provision shall be deemed limited to the extent necessary to render it valid and enforceable and the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

Law Governing Agreement

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State

BACKGROUND:

Air revision of AR 5123 will be presented. The Assistant Superintendent and GEMS staff met to suggest these changes. The major change is the consequence for students in sixth and seventh grade that do not meet promotion criteria. In the old policy, these students were "assigned" to summer school. In the new policy, the criteria currently used at eighth grade will be applied to sixth and seventh grade.

ADMINISTRATION'S RECOMMENDATION:

AR 5123 (a)

STUDENTS

Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

Acceleration from Kindergarten to First Grade

A student enrolled in kindergarten may be admitted to the first grade at the discretion of the Superintendent or designee and with the consent of the parent/guardian, upon determination that the child is ready for first-grade work. (Education Code 48011)

Admission shall be subject to the following minimum criteria: (5 CCR 200)

- 1. The student is at least five years of age.
- 2. The student has attended a public school kindergarten for a long enough time to enable school personnel to evaluate his/her ability.
- 3. The student is in the upper five percent of his/her age group in terms of general mental ability.
- 4. The physical development and social maturity of the student are consistent with his/her advanced mental ability.
- 5. The parent/guardian of the student has filed a written statement with the school district approving the placement in first grade.

Continuation in Kindergarten

Students who have completed one year of kindergarten shall be admitted to first grade unless the parent/guardian and the district agree that the student shall continue in kindergarten for not more than one additional school year. (Education Code 48011)

Whenever a student continues in kindergarten for an additional year, the Superintendent or designee shall secure an agreement, signed by the parent/guardian, stating that the student shall continue in kindergarten for not more than one additional school year. (Education Code 46300)

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Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

Retention at Other Grade Levels

The Superintendent or designee shall require teachers to identify students who should be retained or who are at risk of being retained at the following grade levels: (Education Code 48070.5)

- 1. Between grades 2 and 3
- 2. Between grades 3 and 4
- 3. Between grades 4 and 5
- 4. Between grades 5 and 6
- 5. Between grades 8 and 9

Students between grades 2 and 3 and grades 3 and 4 shall be identified primarily on the basis of their level of proficiency in reading. Proficiency in reading, language arts and mathematics shall be the basis for identifying students between grades 4 and 5, 5 and 6, and 8 and 9. (Education Code 48070.5)

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(cf. 6142.91 - Reading/Language Arts Instruction)
(cf. 6142.92 - Mathematics Instruction)
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Students shall be identified on the basis of either assessment results or grades and other indicators of academic achievement, as established by Board policy.

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(cf. 5121 - Grades/Evaluation of Student Achievement)
(cf. 6162.5 - Student Assessment)
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The following indicators of performance will be used as the minimum standard for promotion:

- Promotion to third grade: An average grade of "2" (minimum) or better on the reading portion of the student's second grade report card.
- Promotion to fourth grade: An average grade of "2" (minimum) or better on the reading portion of the student's third grade report card.
- Promotion to fifth grade: An average grade of "2" (minimum) or better on the reading, language arts, and math portions of the student's fourth grade report card.
- Promotion to sixth grade: An average grade of "2" (minimum) or better on the reading, language arts, and math portions of the student's fifth grade report card.

• Promotion from sixth to seventh, seventh to eighth, and eighth to ninth grade and assignment to summer school for sixth and seventh grade students: An average grade of "C" or better on the reading, language arts, and math and an overall grade point average of 2.0 or better on the student report card.

Special Needs Students

The local Governing Board has adopted policies for the promotion and retention of students. Promotion is based on the indicators of academic achievement which are identified in Administrative Regulation AR 5123(b).

In most cases a student with special needs will be placed in the age appropriate grade. The IEP team shall consider whether the student can meet the district's academic achievement requirements for promotion. If the IEP team determines that the student can meet the district's academic achievement goals, the IEP team shall document that finding in the IEP and the student will be promoted or retained based on districtwide promotion and retention guidelines (identified in entirety in AR 5123)

If the IEP team determines a student is unable to meet districtwide promotion standards due to the nature or degree of the disability the IEP team will develop an IEP which creates an exception to district requirements for promotion and retention in response to the effects of the disability. The IEP shall specifically state through the goals and objectives what the student is expected to meet in order to be promoted to the next grade level. In addition to setting goals and objectives for promotion, potential consequences will be documented in the IEP and discussed amongst the IEP team with regard to satisfying district requirements for graduation with a diploma.

Accommodations and Modifications

An accommodation is a change in the course, standard, test preparation, location, timing, scheduling, expectations, student response and/or other attribute which provide access for a student with a disability to participate in a course, standard or test, which does not fundamentally alter or lower the standard or expectation of the course, standard or test.

Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

A modification is a change in the course, standard, test preparation, location, timing, scheduling, expectations, student response, and or other attribute which provide access for a student with a disability to participate in a course, standard or test, but which does fundamentally alter or lower the standard or expectation of the course, standard or test. (Freedman, 1999).

If the IEP team determines that a student requires accommodations or modifications in order to assist him or her in demonstrating progress, the IEP team shall specifically document the accommodations or modifications that will be made. The decision to include a commodations or modifications is to be made by the IEP team and shall be made on an individualized basis.

Retention of Special Needs Students

If a student with a disability fails to meet district promotion standards or individual promotion standards identified in the student's IEP, the District shall hold an IEP meeting to determine whether:

- 1. The current IEP appropriately provided for the student's needs
- 2. The manner of assessment, accommodations or modifications identified in the IEP were appropriate
- 3. The services required by the student to make progress were identified in the IEP and provided to the student
- 4. Assessments conducted were consistent with the IEP
- 5. Were the linguistic needs of English Language Learners appropriately identified?

Where a student with a disability is held to District academic achievement criteria and the student has been provided all of the services necessary (as determined by the IEP team) for the student to progress in the general education curriculum, the student may be retained based on the criteria for retention applied to other students.

Where a student with a disability has individualized achievement criteria identified on the student's IEP, the student may only be retained upon recommendation of the IEP team.

Limited English Proficient/English Language Learners

The English Language Learner (ELL) student's Bilingual Individualized Learning Plan (BILP) is the determining factor for expected levels of performance and achievement. Students with a BILP should be promoted or retained based on adherence to the BILP goals and objectives. A BILP may include accommodations that alter the mode of assessment in response to a student's English level. These accommodations must appear in the student's BILP.

(cf. 5121 - Grades/Evaluation of Student Achievement) (cf. 6162.5- Student Assessment)

If a student is identified as performing below the minimum standard for promotion, the student shall be retained in his/her current grade level unless the student's identified teacher(s) determine, in writing, that retention is not the appropriate intervention for the student's academic deficiencies. This determination shall specify the reasons that retention is not appropriate for the student and shall include recommendations for interventions other than retention that, in the opinion of the teacher, are necessary to assist the student in attaining acceptable levels of academic achievement. (Education Code 48070.5)

Other Factors for Consideration of Promotion

The following factors will be considered when determining whether a student should be promoted, despite academic criteria, to the next grade level. These factors are to be considered secondary to the academic needs and progress of the student.

- 1. Factors related to level of academic achievement: scores on intelligence, achievement and proficiency tests; teacher evaluations of ability, interest and motivation; learning disabilities; knowledge of English.
- 2. Factors related to physical maturity: age, size, sex, physical coordination, and general health.
- 3. Factors related to social and emotional maturity: ability to communicate, social adaptability, emotional difficulties, social attitudes..
- 4. Previous retention.
- 5. Family situation: age and grade placement of siblings, family stability or transiency.
- 6. Student's and parents/guardians' attitude towards school and towards retention.
- 7. If in Special Education, an adjustment of the special program is the usual alternative to retention



Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

Summer School Alternative to Retention

If the identified teacher(s)' (as described below) recommendation to promote is contingent on the student's participation in a summer school or interim session remediation program, the student's academic performance shall be reassessed at the end of the remediation program, and the decision to retain or promote the student shall be reevaluated at that time. The (summer school) teacher's evaluation shall be provided to and discussed with the student's parents/guardians and the (summer school) principal, or designee, before any final determination of retention or promotion (Education Code 48070.5).

This option will be offered to sixth through eighth grade students that did not meet promotion criteria in language arts and/or math if they scored a performance level of "Basic" or higher in the same subject area on the prior year's California Standards Test. If sixth through eighth grade students receive an overall grade point average of less than 2.0, students will be offered the summer school option if they receive a performance level of basic or higher in both language arts and math on their California Standards Tests.

Summer School Intervention at Sixth and Seventh Grade

Parents of students in sixth and seventh grade will be kept informed of their student's academic progress as stated in Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 6146.5. Those students not meeting the middle school minimum indicators of performance shall be assigned to summer school.

General Education Students:

If the student does not have a single regular classroom teacher, the principal or designee shall specify the teacher(s) responsible for the decision to promote or retain the student. (Education Code 48070.5)

Special Education Students meeting Districtwide Promotion Criteria:

For areas included in the student's IEP, the student's special education teacher will serve as the identified teacher. For all other subject areas the principal or designees shall specify the teacher(s) responsible for the decision to promote or retain the student.

Special Education Students Requiring Individual Promotion Standards Determined by the IEP Team:

18.6

The IEP team will determine whether the student is retained based on the individualized promotion standards (goals and objectives) identified in the student's IEP.

An English Language Development/Bilingual/CLAD/SDAIE teacher will be the identified teacher for those students with a Bilingual Individualized Learning Plan.

Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

When a student is identified as being at risk of retention, the identified teacher(s) or shall so notify the student's parents/guardians as early in the school year as practicable. The student's parent/guardian shall be provided an opportunity to consult with the teacher(s) responsible for the decision to promote or retain the student. (Education Code 48070.5)

(cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications)

Identification of Students at Risk of Retention

Site administrators are responsible for implementing the following process for early identification of students at risk of retention:

- 1. Parents will be notified of the retention policy and the contact information for the school staff members(s) they should call about concerns related to their child's academic progress. Parents should also be informed that if they have a concern at any time about the progress of their child, they should contact their school to schedule an appointment.
- 2. A plan will be written and signed between the parent, school and student (if appropriate) by the end of the first seven weeks for any second through fifth grade student at risk of retention. The plan will include specific intervention(s) to diminish the risk of retention. Interventions should include instructional program, but may include any factor contributing to the risk of retention.
- 3. If by the end of the first grading period a student is at risk of retention, a plan may be modified and parents notified to continue or adjust a remedial program or make other recommendations to alleviate the risk of retention. Some of the strategies may include but are not limited to: examining and altering current instructional strategies or materials, tutoring, change in schedule, or referral to support service.
- 2. If by mid-year, the student remains at-risk for retention, additional options may be considered including, but not limited to, referral to an alternative program for more intensive services, access to additional instructional time (during the day, extended

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- day, Saturday) or referral to the Student Study Team, if not yet completed. Parents will be informed in writing of any decisions and results.
- 3. By the end of the second trimester or third quarter, notices will be sent to the parents of students who remain at risk of being retained. Copies of these notifications must be kept in the student's cumulative file. The teacher will keep parents apprised of their child's progress.
- 4. Only when the interventions have been unsuccessful and student has not made sufficient academic progress during the course of the school year will the student be considered for retention. All potential retentions will be reviewed at the site level by the principal or designee with input from the parent.

AR 5123 (h)

STUDENTS Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

If the pupil's identified teacher(s) determines that retention is not the appropriate intervention for the pupil's academic deficiencies, the reasons must be specified in writing to the parent and administrator and must include recommendations for interventions other than retention that are necessary to assist the pupil to attain acceptable levels of student achievement. If the teacher's recommendation to promote is contingent upon the pupil's participation in a remedial program, the pupil's academic performance shall be reassessed at the end of the remediation program and the decision to retain or promote the pupil shall be reevaluated at that time.

Appeals

The decision to retain or promote may be appealed using the following procedure:

The burden shall be on the appealing party to show why the teacher's decision should be overruled. (Education Code 48070.5)

To appeal a teacher's decision, the appealing party shall submit a written request to the Superintendent or designee specifying the reasons why the teacher's decision should be overruled. The appeal request must be initiated within 10 school days of the determination of the teacher. The teacher shall be provided an opportunity to state orally and/or in writing the criteria on which his/her decision was based.

Within 30 days of receiving the request, the Superintendent or designee shall determine whether or not to overrule the teacher's decision. Prior to making this determination, the Superintendent or designee may meet with the appealing party and the teacher. If the Superintendent or designee determines that the appealing party has overwhelmingly proven that the teacher's decision should be overruled, he/she shall overrule the teacher's decision. If the decision is overruled, the identified teacher(s) will not be accountable for the student's academic consequences linked to the superintendent or designee's action.

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The Superintendent or designee's determination may be appealed by submitting a written appeal to the Board within 15 school days of the issuance of the determination. Within 30 days of receipt of a written appeal, the Board shall meet in closed session to decide the appeal. The Board's decision may be made on the basis of documentation prepared as part of the appeal process or, at the discretion of the Board, the Board may also meet with the appealing party, the teacher and the Superintendent/designee to decide the appeal. The decision of the Board shall be final.

If the decision of the Board is unfavorable to the appealing party, he/she shall have the right to submit a written statement of objections which shall become part of the student's record.

Remedial Instruction

With the parent/guardian's consent, the Superintendent or designee may require a student in grades 2 through 9 who has been retained at grade level to participate in a program of direct, systematic and intensive supplemental instruction that meets the requirements of Education Code 37252. Such programs shall be offered during the summer, after school, on Saturdays and/or during intersessions. Services shall not be provided during the regular instructional day if it would result in the student being removed from classroom instruction in the core curriculum. (Education Code 37252.5)

(cf. 6177 - Summer School)

The S uperintendent or designee shall seek the active involvement of parents/guardians and classroom teachers in the development and implementation of these supplemental instructional programs. (Education Code 37252.5)

In addition, the Superintendent or designee may provide supplemental instruction to students in grades 2 through 6 with low scores in mathematics, reading or written expression, in the following priority order: (Education Code 37252.5)

These services shall be provided to students in the following priority order: (Education Code 37252.5)

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- 1. Students who have been recommended for retention or who have been identified as being at risk of retention pursuant to Education Code 48070.5 or district policy
- 2. Students who have been identified as having a deficiency in mathematics, reading or written expression based on the results of the tests administered under the Standardized Testing and Reporting program

This supplemental instruction program shall be developed in accordance with the requirements of Education Code 37252.7

If a special education student attends a district remedial summer school program, the district shall hold an IEP meeting to determine the supports and/or services the student will need to benefit from the program. (Education Code 37252.5)
