This letter is sent to you as the official notification that your five (5) hour Computer Lab Technician position at Carlin C. Coppin Elementary will be reduced from 15 hours a week to 18 hours a week due to the decrease in school enrollment as a result of students transferring to Twelve Bridges Elementary School last year, and to the newly opened Foskett Ranch Elementary School this year.

The Western Placer Unified School District's Board of Trustees will review the reduction of your hours and take action at the October 18, 2005 board meeting held at Lincoln High School. If action is taken to formally reduce your work hours, you will be allowed to complete your current work assignment through December 2, 2005. After the 45-day lay-off notice timeline is completed you will have the option to do one of the following:

- 1. "Bump" the lowest Computer Lab Technician Instructional Aide within the District.
- 2. Choose to accept a voluntary reduction in assigned time in lieu of layoff and be granted the same reemployment rights as persons laid off and shall retain eligibility to be considered for reemployment for an additional period of up to 24 months (63 months total of reemployment eligibility). If you choose this option, you will retain your three hours and forty minutes per day at Carlin C. Coppin Elementary.
- 3. Accept the official lay-off notice due to decreased enrollment and be eligible for reemployment for a period of 39 months and be reemployed in preference to new applicants within the same job classification. If you choose this option, you will retain your five hours within the school district if it becomes available.
