8.1 Discussion SHARED OPPORTUNITY FOR AIRCRAFT RECREATION

(SOAR) – Leaman (12-13 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)

•The Board is being asked to discuss the possibility of using the SOAR program at Glen Edwards Middle School. The program includes students receiving a ride in a private airplane as an incentive. Details are attached and additional information will be shared with the Board.

8.2 Action CAPE PROGRAM – CALIFORNIA ADVANCE PLACEMENT <u>EXPANSION</u> – Boyle (12-13 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)

•California Education Code was recently amended pursuant to Senate Bill 532 to require an annual review of AP course offerings to encourage California schools to offer at least five AP annual review of AP course offerings to encourage California schools to offer at least five AP courses. The College Board, with support from CDE, launched the CAPE Program (California Advanced Placement Expansion) to help bring Advanced Placement® (AP) courses into public schools that offer five or fewer AP courses but have student s with strong potential to be successful in AP based upon PSAT/NMSQT®¹ scores. At the time of the CAPE Program launch, Lincoln High School offered five AP classes and therefore was qualified to participate in this program.

•Pursuant to Government Code section 3547, all proposals of the recognized employee groups and of the District must be presented at a public meeting of the District. REDUCTION IN FORCE – **Davis** (12-13 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V) •Pursuant to Education Codes 44949, 44955 and 44951, the District administration is making a recommendation that will require the Governing Board of the Western Placer Unified School District to reduce or discontinue particular kinds of services in order to reduce the number of certificated employees of the District. In conjunction with the recommendation it is necessary to adopt criteria for determining if a certificated employee would have the competency to replace (bump) another certificated employee out of their position. The District must have a way to ensure that when one certificated employee may potentially replace (bump) another certificated employee that they possess the necessary competency in order to provide adequate services. *Roll call vote:*
