5. COMMUNICATION FROM THE PUBLIC

Jeff Duer read the following: I am a teacher at LHS and I appreciate the opportunity to be here to speak to you tonight. You may be wondering what all these staff members from Lincoln High School are doing here on a Tuesday night? We are not here to ask for a salary or benefits increase. We simply have one request... We would like to invite the WPUSD School board members and Administration to come to Lincoln High School to participate in a series of forums to discuss how we all can improve the educational delivery system at LHS.

As you are aware, Lincoln high school is going through the WASC accreditation this year. This has created some lively discussions among teachers, administrators, and classified personnel on how to improve LHS. One of the questions that has come up within our focus groups is what is actually done with the WASC report once the process is complete? We want to make sure that it is not just filed with no real attempts at improving LHS in a meaningful way.

We understand that WPUSD is just that... a unified district, however, many staff members strongly believe emphasis needs to be placed on Lincoln High School since it is the only comprehensive high school in the district. LHS necessitates special consideration and attention; it cannot be viewed as just 1 of the 11 schools in WPUSD. Please, invest in LHS!

I would like to emphasize...this is NOT a union movement. And this is not administrative action. We're also not here to gripe and complain to you tonight. No individual is leading this grass-roots effort to improve LHS... it has sprung up naturally out of necessity ... and many, many staff members share in this vision to improve LHS.

Imagine workers in a factory. They use their specific skills to build a product on the assembly line. One day after work, several of these workers started sharing ideas on how to improve the finished product. Many of them had good ideas. All they needed was the opportunity to sit down with the factory managers to explain their ideas. All we, the staff members at LHS, are asking for is the opportunity to sit down and discuss how to improve Lincoln High School... because we're not talking about a "finished Product" in a factory, we are talking about students' education! Please, invest in LHS student! Thank you.

Mary McQueen teacher at LHS for 20 years, she discussed the growth at LHS, need emphasis at the high school, we're a unified district, but we need to put the emphasis at LHS. We have programs no other schools have, so we need to focus on who we are. Staff ratios have not increased with the student ratio. We have talked about inviting board members and district administration, invited board to take a tour of LHS. Jennifer Horton, Science teacher at LHS for the past 10 years, and would like to piggyback on the wonderful growth, feeling over shadowed by all the elementary schools. Feels like they are in the shadow of all the growth, teachers, secretaries, custodial, feels we need a career and college center. One that can help students find good colleges and careers. It's a good school, and good staff, and would also like board members to visit the school and classrooms.

7.1 Action ACCEPTANCE OF BID FROM HOMETOWN CONSTRUCTION FOR THE DISTRICT OFFICE DATA ROOM HVAC PROJECT—

Kilpatrick (14-15 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)

•To relieve the ongoing issue of inadequate cooling within the Data (or Server) Room at the District Office on the 4th Floor of city Hall Building, we have solicited bids for the improvement work that is outlined in plans and specification by Rainforth Grau Architects.

Audrey Kilpatrick introduced Mike Adell as the new Director of Facilities for the district, who will be starting on December15th. She also presented a bid for hometown construction for a bigger HVC system to be put in the Server Room at the District Office. Motion by Mr. Armitage, seconded by Mr. Carras, and passed by a 5-0 (Ayes: Armitage, Haley, Long, Carras, Wyatt, No: None) vote to approve the bid from Hometown Construction.

7.2 Information/ <u>ELEMENTARY EDUCATIONAL SPECIFICATION UPDATE</u>—

•The District has committed to renewing our vastly outdated Educational Specifications for all grade levels, but beginning with Elementary. In addition to this being an integral part of planning out any future sites, or modernizations to current sites, it also is a requirement for submission to California Department of Education Prior to approval of any changes to school sites or construction of new school sites.

Audrey Kilpatrick reported they have been meeting timelines, which shows what needs to be done. This item is for information only, the Proposal will be coming for approval in January.

7.3 Action

APPROVE RESOLUTION #14/15.12 – WPUSD – INTENT TO REIMBURSE CERTAIN EXPENDITURES FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAX-EXEMPT INDEBTEDNESS-Kilpatrick (14-15 G & O Component I, II, III, IV, V)

•Resolution No. 14/15.12is adopted solely for the purposes of establishing compliance with the requirements of section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations as amended. The Board expects the District will pay certain project costs prior to the issuance of tax-exempt indebtedness for the project. With this resolution the Board declares the District's official intent is to use proceeds of tax-exempt indebtedness to reimburse the District for certain project costs, in such amounts and at such times as may be necessary or convenient, and as allowed by applicable law.

Audrey Kilpatrick presented the Resolution for approval due to the bond. This will allow use of expenditures and any monies used can be paid back with the bond. This could include design, or professional fees. Motion by Mr. Haley, seconded by Mr. Armitage, and passed by a 5-0 (Ayes: Long, Armitage, Carras, Haley, Wyatt, No: None) roll call vote to approve Resolution #14/15.12 for Intent to reimburse certain expenditures from the proceeds of tax-exempt indebtedness.

7.4 Information/ MEASURE A BOND UPDATE - TIMELINE OF ELECTION **RESULTS CERTIFICATION AND GENERAL OBLIGATION** BOND CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT- Leaman/Kilpatrick (14-15 G & O Component I, II, III, IV,

•With the successful passage of the Measure A General Obligation Bond, the District must undertake actions relating to the issuance and sale of bonds authorized by Measure A. Staff will present an overview of the necessary actions and timelines related to the bond to include certain resolutions, certifications and establishment of a Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee.

Mr. Leaman reported that Measure A did pass with 61% of the vote. The district is excited that this bond will improve LHS, there is a plan that was put together by architects it shows how LHS can be improved. There have been inquires about the oversight committee. Dan Muroche with Lozano Smith is here to discuss the process of the Bond oversight committee, created by Prop39. Mr. Muroche reviewed the following committee guidelines:

- One bond committee would provide oversight over both projects which include the one bond
- Spends money on the project list
- Actively reviews
- Reviews annual audits, annual requirement by independent auditor
- Their role is to communicate to the public
- To review expenditures that are made by board and staff
- Size of committee, minimum of 7
- Timeline of establishment oversight committee is within 60 days of passing a Resolution on passing certification of the bond

- Must have business representative, senior representative, parent of student, PTO representative, tax payer representative, at large members. Who can't serve – district employees, board members, contractors, and consultants.
- In January Capital Finance will come and discuss how the sell the bonds.

Next step is certification

Tara McCrowskey WPTA President shared she is excited about the bond, and the show of community support, building the community we want Lincoln to be. She thanked the school board for putting the bond out. Thanked the community for their support. Let's celebrate!
